We uniformly tie TREES in bundles of 10; GRAPE VINES and SMALL FRUITS in bundles of 25; and as unbroken bundles are handled at less expense, we can thereby afford these unusual concessions.

THREE Sizes of all fruit trees are made in our grading houses: **XX Size** is the size sure to please; **X Size** excels "1st class" of some. Each size is 1st class of that grade; no second class, defective or cull trees go into any size, but to the brush pile. Larger sizes are graded by caliper (diameter) to similar thickness or stockiness of body—a true sign of quality. When graded by both caliper and height, the caliper governs, as height then named is approximated. Of course, dwarfish growing sorts are not so tall, nor are kinds of various habits of growth all alike.

One-Year Apple are also graded into three sizes—3 to 5 ft., 2½ to 3 ft. and 2 to 2½ ft. Our 2½ to 3 ft. are superior to the largest 1-yr. of many nurseries.

Young, healthy, thrifty 1- or 2-yr. stock of X or even 3d size, is very different from small, old, rough, stunted trees culled from 4- and 5-yr. blocks.

PEACH

LARGE PEACH TREES.—As a general proposition I want a large peach tree, and plant lots of them 6 and 8 ft. high. I used to try and make myself believe I wanted small trees, but experience has shown me that I do not. I want good big ones. I cut the top off at a height of 18 inches or 2 ft. and remove the side branches. If only one bud puts forth it is apt to discourage the planter, but it should be allowed to grow. The next season cut it back, leaving 3 or 4 buds, and it will put forth shoots which will make a fine top for the low-headed tree. Yes, I want big peach trees, and know they are best for the general planter.—J. H. Hale, the "Peach King," in Western Fruit Grower.

ROOT GRAFTS

Root Grafts are scions and roots grafted ready for planting in nursery rows. Grafting season begins in Dec., closes in March. Grafts shipped in winter are packed in **paper lined** boxes to prevent freezing; they weigh about 25 lbs. per 1000, and expense of transportation is small. Keep in a cool, dark cellar. Prepare the ground well, and plant about 15,000 per acre, as soon as frost is out in spring; allow but one bud to project above the surface, and **firmly press** the soil, particularly about the root and union, being **very careful** not to disturb the union.

Whole-Root Grafts are grafted at the **natural crown** and then roots **properly pruned back**, so that they will produce the best possible trees.

Stark Grafts are put up by experienced men who are paid by the day, and **not** by the 1000, and we have large orchards from which to cut scions. Nevertheless, we must advise orchard planters and those **inexperienced**, to buy trees, even if small size, instead; they will get orchards quicker and more certainly. For practical tree growers, Apple, Crab, and sometimes Pear grafts, are well enough. **Stone Fruits**, etc., we grow by budding.

Order Early to insure Graft orders being filled. To secure good stand early planting is necessary. Trees plant successfully after it is too late to plant grafts. Grafting season usually closes in March.

N. B. Grafts are supplied **without any guarantee** whatever other than that they will be true to label, and be delivered to transportation company in **good condition**. If not received in good condition claim must be made on Transportation Co., **not** on us; and we cannot replace, nor can we be held responsible in any way for grafts that fail to grow; quality and condition of soil, season, proper planting, care—all and each of these has **everything** to do with their success.

All Stark Grafts are made to **SPECIAL ORDER** and **as ordered**, then packed separately till time to ship. We do not make up Grafts ahead of orders, nor to carry in stock—except for our own planting.

Cheaper Grafts can be made if wanted—in lots of 5000 or over. But neither the material nor workmanship will equal that we use in Grafts made for our own use—which is the **Best**. And Stark Grafts to fill your order will be **exactly the same**. Even if you order Piece-roots you will get the **best** Piece-root Grafts that can be made.

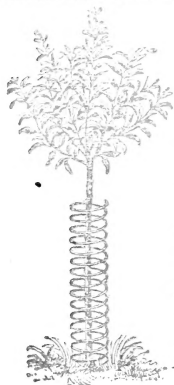
