


Orders to be sent C. O. D. must be accompanied by cash to one-fourth of the value of goods ordered, to guarantee acceptance.

All perishable plants and bulbs ordered shipped by freight will be properly packed and delivered to transportation company here. Consignee must then assume all responsibility as to damage by heat, frost or delay.






