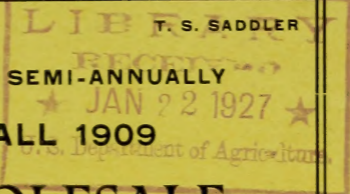

TERMS CASH: Remit by postal or express order, or bank draft, payable to the order of SADDLER BROS. Stock shipped C. O. D. when one-half cash is advanced.

PRICES, except noted, are for first-class stock. *Rates on larger quantities than herein quoted will be given on application.* Five furnished at the 10 rate, fifty at 100, five hundred at 1,000. On wholesale orders we reserve the right to select varieties, but always adhere as closely as possible to instructions. *Long specified lists are subject to special prices.*

ORDERS. Write separate from letter. State:

2. Mode of shipment—mail, express or freight.

PACKING is done in boxes or burlaps, with moss and straw, for which a moderate charge is made.

SHIPPING generally begins October 1 and March 1. To the south we ship from frost-proof cellars all winter. Bloomington is a great railroad center, thus affording competition in rates. The express companies here are the United States, National and American. After delivery of stock at the railroad depot or express office, our responsibility ceases. All claims for rebate must be made within six days after receipt of stock.

GUARANTEE. All stock is sold and warranted true to name on the sole and express conditions, that should any prove untrue, it will either be replaced with the genuine variety or purchase price refunded.
