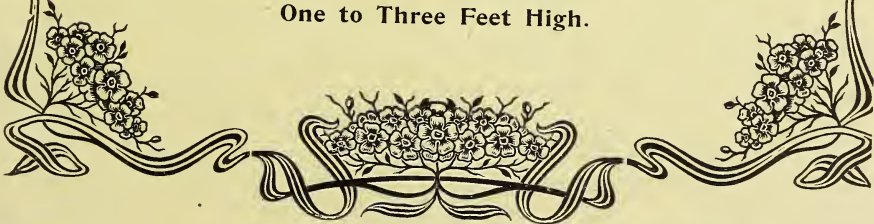

FIELD GROWN ROSES.

- ABEL CARRIER—Dark velvety crimson; very fine and double, 25c.
- AGRIPPINA—Velvety crimson; constant bloomer; clear pink.
- AMERICAN BEAUTY—Rich rose color; blooms on long stiff stems; very large and fine, 25c.
- ARCH DUKE CHARLES—Variegated from clear pink to deep rosy carmine on same plant.
- BALTIMORE BELLE—White, flushed with pink; Spring bloomer.
- BARON PREVOST—Rosy pink; incurved petals.
- BLANCH MOREAU—Pure white semi-double long pointed buds; moss.
- BON SILENE—Rosy salmon, shaded carmine.
- BOUGERE—Light rosy salmon.
- BRIDE—Pure white, tinged with lilac in the Fall; large size, 25c.
- BUSH DEVONIENSIS—Flesh, shaded pink; called the "Magnolia Rose;" very fragrant.
- CAPT. CHRISTY—Light silvery rose; large bloom; very fine.
- CATHERINE MERMET—Peach pink, shaded amber.
- CLOTILDE SOUPERT—White pink centre; very double; constant bloomer.
- CLIMBING CLOTILDE SOUPERT—Like Clotilde Soupert, differs only by being a strong climber and larger blooms; 25c.
- CREAM CLUSTER—Cream; shaded salmon blooms in clusters; very fragrant.
- CRIMSON RAMBLER—Large clusters of rich crimson flowers; will grow 15 feet in one season; blooms only in Spring.
- DOROTHY PERKINS—Light pink; large clusters; Climber; Rambler.
- DUTCHESS De BRABANT—Light rosy pink, shaded amber.
- DUKE De CAZIS—Dark velvety crimson, full and fine.
- DR. SEWELL—Very dark velvet crimson, full and fine.
- EMPRESS OF CHINA—Bright pink, like Pink Daily, differs by being climber.
- EMPRESS OF JAPAN—Deep carmine, shaded maroon.
- FRANCES LEVET—Clear bright rose.
- GOLDEN GATE—Creamy pink, very fine.
- GEN. JACQUEMINOT—Fine velvety scarlet; an old favorite.
- GEN. WASHINGTON—Soft and bright crimson.
- PAPA GONTIER—Bright rose color.
- HELEN GAMBIER—Coppery rose; very full of varying colors.
- HENRY MARTIN—Moss rose; pink.
- HER MAJESTY—Silvery rose, waxy, erect stiff canes; 25c.
- ISABELLE SPRUNT—Canary yellow, beautiful buds.
- IVORY WHITE GOLDEN GATE.
- JUBILEE—Rich glowing crimson.
- KING OF SWEDEN—Rich, dark velvety maroon, changing to purple.
- LA GRANDEUR—Dark pink, veined with carmine and white.
- LA FRANCE—Silvery rose, satin sheen; a favorite with everyone.
- MARIE ANTOINETTE—Bright rosy pink.
- MARY WASHINGTON—Clusters white.
- MARIE PAVIE—White, tinged with pink (Polyantha).
- MARECHAL NEIL—Deep golden yellow, 25c.
- MARQUIS De BOUCHELLE—Rosy salmon, incurved petals.
- MAMAN COCHET—Deep rosy salmon pink; long, pointed buds, 25c.
- MME. CAMILLE—Soft rosy flesh.
- MME. JOSEPH SCHWARTZ—White, tinged with salmon, pink.
- MME. SCHWALLER—Bright, rosy salmon pink.
- MME. MOREAU—Deep purplish crimson, very double; beautiful.
- MME. PLANTIER—Pure white, fine double; Spring bloomer.
- MME. WELCHE—Coppery yellow, tinged with pink; very large and beautiful; 25c.
- NEMESIS—Very dark, rich velvety crimson changing to purple; constant bloomer.
- OCTAVIA—Bright, clear rosy pink; half climber.
- PAUL NEYRON—Clear, deep rose color; largest rose in cultivation; old favorite.

PERLE DeJARDIN—Chrome yellow, very double; 25c.

PRINCE CAMILLE De ROHAN—Dark, rich velvety crimson, changing to maroon.

PRINCESS BONNIE—Solid rich crimson.

PRINCESS BEATRICE—Salmon pink, changing to clear rosy pink.

REGALAS—Rosy carmine, shaded salmon

REINE MARIA HENRIETTA—Cherry red; very fine climber; 25c.

REV. J. B. CAMM—Deep rose color; very full and fragrant.

ROGER LAMBERLIN—Deep velvety carmine crimson, edged with white, fringed, very much like double fringed petunia; 25c.

RAINBOW—Clear pink, striped with crimson.

W. A. RICHARDSON—Coppery yellow, shaded to canary on edges of the petals.

SAFRANO—Coppery yellow; beautiful buds.

SOMBREIUL—White, flushed with rose.

SOLFATERRE—Sulphur yellow, climber; very fragrant; 25c.

ULRICH BRUNNER—Rosy crimson, very large full flower.

VICK'S CAPRICE—Clear pink, striped with white.

WHITE RAMBLER—Large clusters of white blooms; growth like crimson climber; Spring bloomer.

WOODLAND MARGARET—White, beautiful pointed buds; constant bloomer; very fragrant; climber

ZELIA PRADEL—White creamy center; incurved petals; very desirable.

CRIMSON RAMBLER—Large clusters of crimson flowers.

PINK RAMBLER—Large clusters of pink flowers

WHITE RAMBLER—White clusters.

YELLOW RAMBLER—Large clusters.

HELENE—(Thornless)—Clusters of pink flowers.

DOROTHY PERKINS—(New)—Large clusters of light pink, medium sized roses.

LA MARQUE—White, with creamy incurved center.

MURIEL GRAHAM—White, flushed with pink and lilac.

RAINBOW—Beautiful pointed buds; a bright rose, striped with scarlet.

MABEL MORRISON—White, tinged with pink.

FRANCES WILLARD—Pure white 1 bud.

CLARA WATSON—Fine large flower; bright satiny pink.

ROBERT DUNCAN—Pink, tinged with orange.

WALTHAM—Pink; climber.

ORNAMENTAL SHRUBBERY AND TREES.

One Dollar per Dozen Except where Noted.

SPIREA PRUNIFOLIA.....	Blooms February and March.
SPIREA REVESII.....	Bridal Wreath, snow white.
SPIREA REVESII.....	Flora Pleno, each little floret double like a daisy.
FORSYTHIA.....	Golden Bell, blooms in March.
JAPAN QUINCE.....	Earliest of all to bloom; Scarlet.
BUDLEA.....	Long racemes of purple flowers, from June until Frost.
WISTARIA.....	Fast growing vine; purple flowers in the Spring.
HONEYSUCKLE.....	White, everblooming.
PERIWINKLE EVERGREEN.....	Trailing vine, blue flowers in early Spring.
SPIREA UMBELLATA.....	Everblooming; pinkish lilac.

HARDY YELLOW SUMMER LILLIES.

WEIGELA ROSEA.....	Beautiful blooms like Jessamine, but of light pink color.
MAGNOLIA GRANDIFLORA.....	Field grown, 36 inches, 25c.
