

CERTIFICATE OF INSPECTION

DOVER, DELAWARE, Aug. 25, 1910.

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

This certifies that I have this day examined the nursery stock and premises of the Bridgeville Nurseries of Messrs. Myer and Son, at Bridgeville, Sussex County, Delaware, and that said nursery stock is apparently free from crown gall, peach yellows, peach rosette, the San Jose Scale, and all other plant diseases and insects of a seriously dangerous nature.

This certificate may be revoked by the State Board of Agriculture for cause, and it is invalid after August 31, 1911, and does not include nursery stock not grown on the above named premises unless such stock is covered by certificate of a state or government officer and accepted by the State Board of Agriculture.

NOTICE TO CORRESPONDENTS

Our customers are some of the leading fruit growers of Delaware, Maryland, Pennsylvania, New York, New Jersey, Connecticut, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Nebraska, Mississippi, Tennessee, Texas, Virginia, North Carolina, South Carolina and Alabama.

Send in your orders early, particularly if for distant transportation. Bear in mind we can ship almost any month of the winter if to go South; though October, November, and December are by far the best months to ship South for southern planting.

Write your orders plainly on a separate sheet of paper, and not in body of letter. State definitely varieties, age, size and number.

All orders from unknown parties should be accompanied by cash or satisfactory reference. We refer any strangers as to our standing, etc., to the First National Bank, Seaford, Del.

We are in no case responsible for loss or damage to goods in transit. Our responsibility ceases on delivery to shipping agents.

If selection of varieties is left to us we will select according to our best judgment and long experience. When varieties are specified we will substitute for such as we may not have, kinds equally good and ripening at the same season, unless otherwise ordered

Persons who send cash with the order may deduct five per cent. from the list price, except on mail packages. No discount unless the cash reaches us before shipment.

Five hundred will be furnished at the thousand rate; fifty at the hundred rate (on trees only.)

Write your name plainly and distinctly, and give your Post Office, County and State, and route which goods are to be shipped over.

Mistakes. Yes, we make them, sometimes; when made we wish to correct them. We try to avoid mistakes; rarely make the same one the second time. Thus, mistakes do us good; they improve our service. We are afraid of the man who "never makes mistakes."

Guarantee of Genuineness. We exercise the greatest care to keep our varieties PURE and TRUE to name, and hold ourselves in readiness at all times to replace, on proper proof, all stock that may prove otherwise, or refund the amount paid; but it is mutually agreed between the purchaser and ourselves, that we shall not be liable for any amount greater than the original price of the goods.

Grades. We grade carefully; in some cases by caliper, others by height. When by both, the caliper must govern. The lower number is included, and the higher number excluded. For instance, in a grade from four to five feet, four foot trees are included, but five foot go into the next grade. If plump five foot trees are wanted, the order must be for five to six feet.






OLD MIXON
