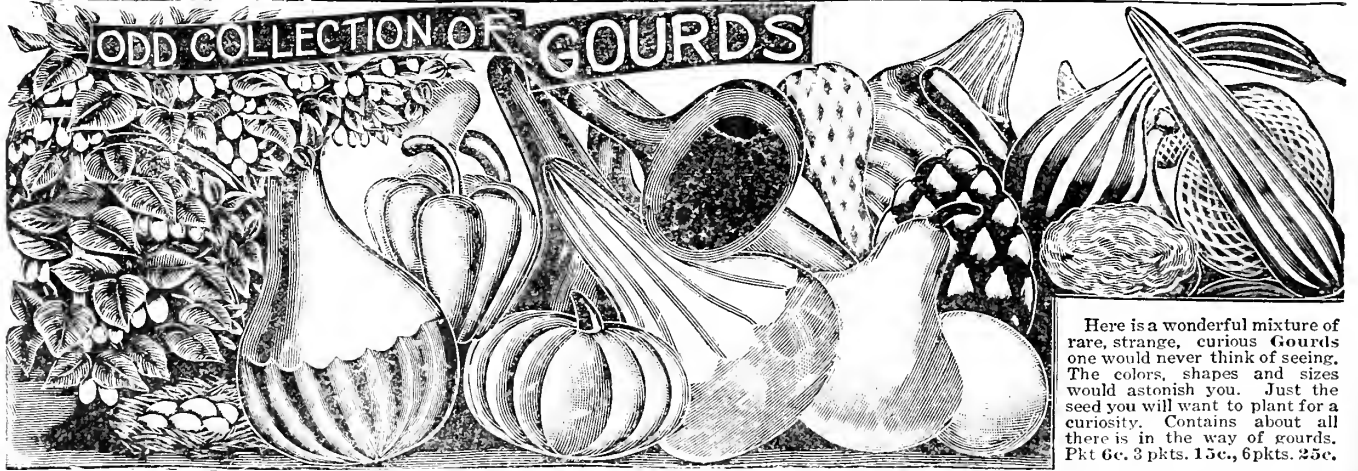

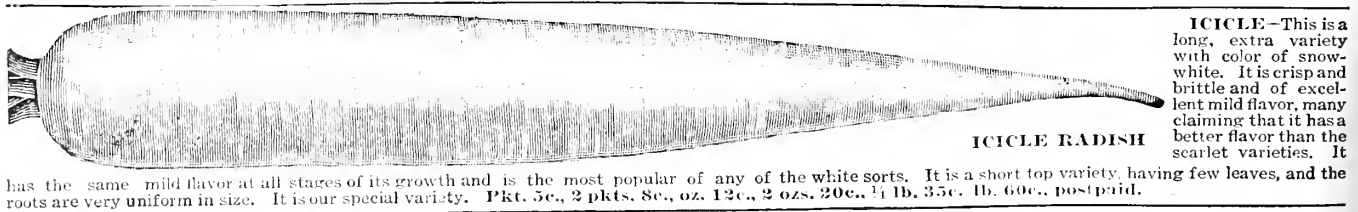

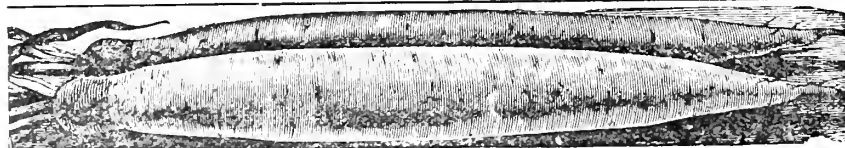

How to Order--In making out your order, always write Name, Post-office, County and State and the varieties you want, quantity of each, and carry out the catalogue price after each one and enclose the total amount in any convenient form of remittance and send it to us by mail. Be sure to use our Order Blank if you have it.

Mail or Express--We send Seed postpaid by mail at the prices named in this catalogue, except where there are special quotations for the goods to be sent by Express, customers to pay the charges. To points where the Express Companies touch, we can send some orders as cheaply by express as by mail. Whenever we do this we notify the purchaser to that effect.

Express or Freight--We do not prepay Express or Freight, except in case we have quite an order purchased at postpaid prices to deliver and may prefer to send by Express prepaid.

It can be cut when two or three feet high, after which it will rapidly grow up and as many as four crops have been cut during a season. The amount of forage per acre from this plant is something immense; in many cases from 150 to 200 tons. It should be planted in hills two feet apart each way and three pounds is sufficient for one acre.

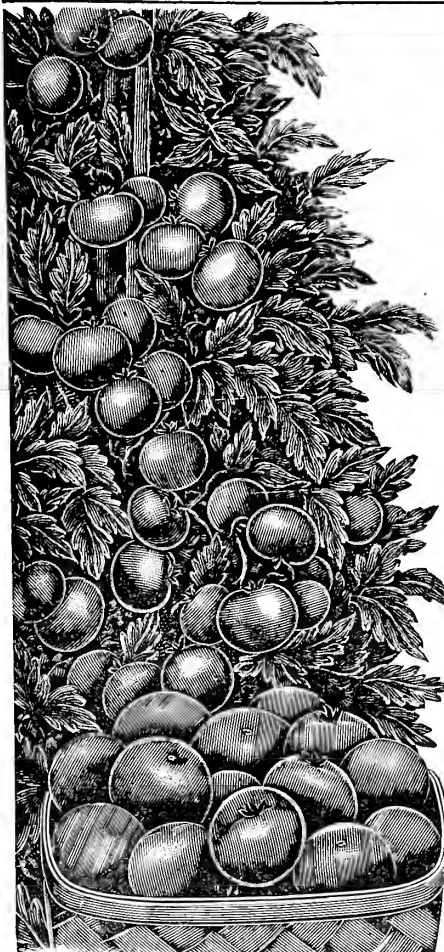

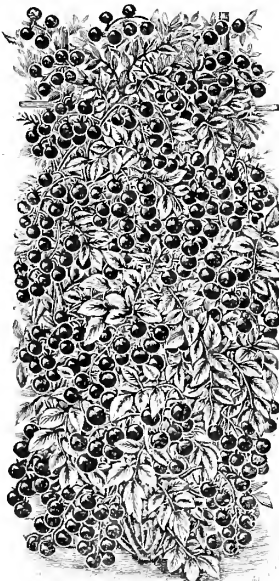
TOMATO GRAPES

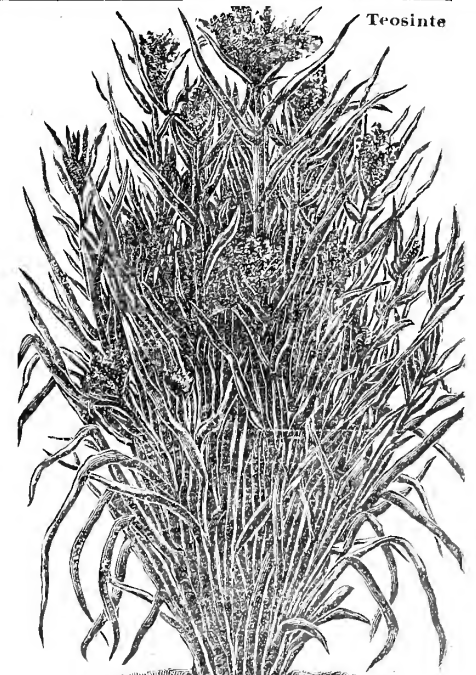
