## Telegraphic Cipher (or Cable Code)

 FOR WEIGHTS AND MEASURES.The telegraphic cipher word for quantities must always precede the cipher words for seed, but if the same quantity of several varieties is ordered, the cipher word meaning that quantity need be placed only betore the first. For example:

Arad Jaundice, Jean, Benares, Calliope, Lamprey, Malmo Balcony, would mean, ship at once, cheapest route, ten pounds each Helen Pierce and Janet Scott Sweet Peas, twenty-five pounds each Burpee's Allhead Early Cabbage and Burpee's Earliest Wayahead Lettuce and ten bushels Burpee's Stringless Green-Pod Bean.

Gur customers will find this a very inexpensive way of wiring their orders, but we must caution them that care be taken in writing out the messages, as we cannot hold ourselves responsible for errors arising from incomplete messages or incorrect translation.

IMPORTANT. - This telegraphic cipher must be used ONLY on orders by telegraph or cable, and never in written orders sent by mail.

## TELEGRAPHIC CIPHER FOR PRICES.

The cipher or code-words given on this page are principally for our use in making quotations. For example :

Dab Cefalu Carding Debauch, Tokay Bacon Densely, would mean : In reply to your telegram, we quote for immediate acceptance upon our usual terms for special quotations, provided unsold upon receipt of your order, one hundred pounds Burpee's Surehead Cabbage at $\$ 1.65$ per pound, two hundred bushels Extra Early Red Valentine Bean at $\$ 4.25$ per bushel. These code-words can be used also if, when placing a telegraphic order, you wish to specify price quoted. For example :

Dare Angola Perturb Deburse Mocha Bib Dew, meaning: Ship at once by freight, as per special quotations, five pounds Ruby King Pepper at $\$ 1.8 \overline{5}$ per pound, sixteen bushels Burpee's Bush Lima Bean at $\$ 6.50$ per bushel.

In $\boldsymbol{F}^{\gg}$ By exercising ordinary care in preparing the telegram you can save time and money by the use of our code system. When possible, telegraphic orders are filled and shipped the same day they are received.

Packets, although not dated (because the electrotypes generally require the entire front of the bag), are all filled with the same choice quality of the Best Seeds that Grow for 1914.

## W. ATLEE BURPEE \& CO., Seed Growers.

Seeds of the best quality cost very much more to produce than do seeds of the ordinary commercial grade. And yet many merchants, having little or no knowledge of the value of High=class Seeds, purchase their supplies wherever they can be obtained the cheapest. It was brought to our notice that some merchants would buy a bill of seeds from us, obtain copies of our catalogs and show-cards, and then purchase a portion of their supplies from other seedsmen, who, growing "cheap seeds," could sell at much lower prices. In many cases planters who purchased from their local merchants, thinking that they were obtaining BURPEE'S SEEDS, got only a few of our seeds (perhaps in packets), and often the seeds bought by weight or measure were of inferior quality, falsely sold on our reputation, but for which we were not in any way responsible.

This deception was brought so prominently to our attention some years ago that we debated seriously whether we should not decline altogether to sell BURPEE'S SEEDS at wholesale. Further consideration, however, showed us that this would hardly be fair to the honorable merchants who had been handling our seeds exclusively for years. Therefore we announced that-

> Hereafter we will sell Burpee's Seeds ONLY in sealed packages.

Packets and ounces, in Water-tight Manila Bags, are sealed, and bear, plainly printed, either our Name or Registered Trade=mark Monogram, protected by United States Letters Patent. Quarter-pounds, pounds, pints, and quarts, in paper bags, have pasted across the top a green label, as below :


Facsimile of our wellsknown "Green Seal."
SEEDS IN BULK,-that is. Peas, Beans, etc., by the peck or hushel, and quantities of small seeds in bags, will have each sack sealed with our Trade Mark on a leaden seal.

This plan will be a protection to honest merchants from competition with other seeds falsely claimed to be BURPEE'S SEEDS, and at the same time will be a guarantee to the purchaser.

## LARGE DEALERS WHO SELL ON THEIR OWN REPUTATION CAN BUY SEEDS IN BULK FROM US, AS HERETOFORE.

While every sack is sealed, the contents can be handled as desired.-except that they must not be sold as BURPEE'S SEEDS, unless in original packages.


The Office at Fordhook Farms, -where Records of Trials and Crops are liept.
This little two-story building (nearly concealed by trees) was the original "farmbouse" at Fordhook. It was built about one hundred and thirty years ago,-long before we entered the seed business (!), -and when farmers and gardeners thought that they must save their own seeds, to be sure of purity! At that time there was not a single seedsman, in anything like the modern sense, in America and but few in Europe. The Seed Trade is of "modern evolution," and it is acknowledged that nowhere has more been done to inspire confidence in "bought seeds" than at Fordhook Farms, - so famous as the largest trial grounds in America.
