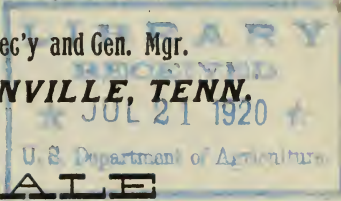

No charge for bags, boxes or barrels for seeds.

Seeds—5 pounds at ten pound rates; 25 pounds at 100 pound rates.

Our responsibility ceases on delivery to transportation company and receipt taken. All orders to prepay stations should be accompanied by cash to cover freight. Add 8 cents for postage. Small orders from strangers should be accompanied by cash.

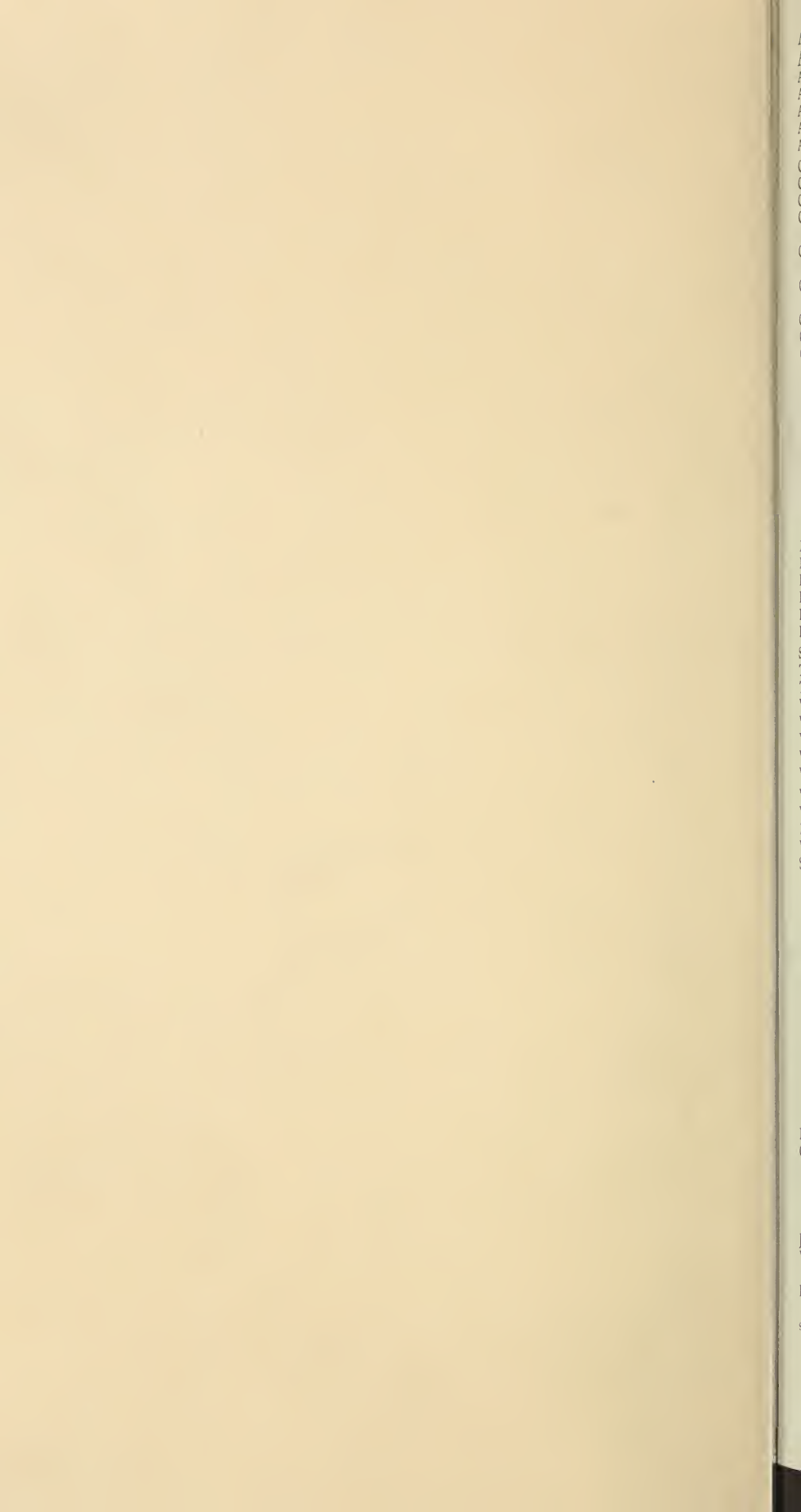
