FALL PLANTING.

The Experiment Stations and large Commercial Orchardists agree that fruit trees especially Apple, Plum and Cherry. give best results when planted in the fall. Fall planted trees become firmly established in their new location during the fall and winter, and as soon as spring opens up start growing. This early start not only means a better growth the first season, but it will enable them to stand the dry weather of summer better than trees planted in the spring.

Trees can be planted in the fall any time up until the ground is frozen too hard to dig. The ground should be prepared earlier and the holes dug so that when the trees arrive they could be planted at once without being trenched in. The longer the trees remain in the nursery row the better, to let them ripen up and drop their leaves. The leaves begin to drop about October first, and the trees as a rule are in good condition to dig by the 10th to 20th, depending somewhat on the season and the early frosts. In stating the time you want stock to arrive put it off as late as you think safe, and we will make it a point to get them to you at that time or a little earlier.

Terms: Cash before shipment except by special agreement. Six per cent discount for full amount of cash with order. Large orders accompanied by one-fourth cash will be accepted if satisfactory references are given; shipment to be sent C. O. D.

Rates: Less than 5 trees of a variety at each rate; 5 trees and over of a variety at 10 rates; 50 trees of a kind at 100 rates, providing there is not less than 10 of any one variety. Different kinds such as 30 Apple and 20 Peach does not entitle you to 100 rates; they must be one kind as 50 Apple or 50 Peach.

Special Rate: If your order amounts to \$20.00 or over net you may select all stock at 100 rates or lowest rate listed.

Packing Free: We make no charge for boxing, packing or delivering to freight station or express office. We pack freight shipments in good tight paper lined boxes using plenty of good moist packing material. Express shipments are baled in flag with paper and burlap around the roots, and we guarantee stock to reach destination in good condition. If there is any cause for complaint, or any mistake in filling your order, we ask that you notify us promptly on receipt of stock, and proper adjustment will be made.

Remittance should be made by Bank Draft, Express Money Order, Post Office Money Order, Registered Letter or by personal check. Make remittance payable to THE WM. J. REILLY NURSERIES.

Order Early even though shipment is not wanted until late in the season. If you can not spare the full amount of cash send one-fourth or 10% with the order and we will reserve the stock for you, the balance you can send when shipment is wanted. Shipping season begins Oct. 1st, but I do not advise shipping until the 20th, or later.

Orders for Spring Shipment will be accepted at prices in this list, and it is a good plan to order nursery stock from six months to one year ahead, especially on large orders, as you are sure of getting just the variety and size wanted, which is not always sure with orders sent in during shipping time. We have a good many orders on our books now for spring shipment, and some for next fall.

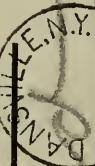
