CULTURE.

Select place where water will not stand after rains and where sun shines most of the day. If soil is very sandy, dig in plenty of leaf mould or stable manure well rotted. Stiff clay soil should have sand, leaf mould or leached ashes dug in. If poor, well-rotted manure. Dig up the bed deep and plant 3 feet apart each way. Lay bulb down flat and cover 3 to 6 inches deep. When up, cultivate well. April 1st to June 15th is very well for planting. Good soil and good cultivation mean success.
