All evergreens are dug only as needed for orders, roots are immediately mudded and baled in wet moss. This insures the roots being in good condition when delivered to the customer.

Select specimen trees can be supplied, dug with a ball of earth attached to the roots. This is covered with burlap tightly secured. Evergreens so treated are just about certain to grow. This method is especially successful in the prairie sections and where fine specimens are wanted for lawn where they cannot be cultivated.
