

ASTERS

Asters are one of the most important summer and autumn flowers, and for a number of years I have been making exhaustive tests of both home-grown and imported stocks with a view to offering only the choicest kinds, regardless of cost. As a result of this care my list comprises only such sorts as can be planted with confidence that nothing better is procurable as a Cut Bloom. The collection includes the Early, Mid-Season and Late Varieties, all of the choicest colors. The height of the plants and diameter of the blossoms will vary according to condition of soil and the skill of the grower. Asters require new soil each year, and very rich. It cannot be made any too rich; and require an abundance of water during the growing season. With special cultural skill, the height of plants and the diameter of blossoms will exceed the measurement given.

QUEEN OF THE MARKET ASTERS

A first class early flowering Aster, coming into flower in July, or fully three weeks in advance of the general run: of branching habit, flowers $2\frac{1}{2}$ to 3 inches diameter, and borne on long stems, making them exceedingly valuable for cutting; excellent for growing under glass. LATE BRANCHING ASTERS

The Famous American Aster Seeds Grown in Oregon.

This superb strain of American origin, is especially adapted to our climatic condition; it has long been one of Florist leading specialties, as a cut bloom. The plants form strong, branching bushes, 2 to $2\frac{1}{2}$ feet high, bearing on long, strong stems their handsome Chrysanthemum-like flowers, which under ordinary cultivation, average 5 inches across. The form of the flowers, together with the length of the stems, places them at the head of Asters for cutting. They come into bloom from two to three weeks after the average type, usually being at their best during September, and filling in the gap between the general run of Asters and Chrysanthemums; and all things considered, are the most valuable of all Asters either for cutting or for bedding.
