and a little larger. Very large. Yellow, red at pit, meat tender, juicy. An excellent cling for table, canning, or sweet pickles. Not quite as tartish as Elberta. Ripens middle of September. Bore first crop 1911. Price 25c each.

Banana, very large, creamy white, meat of excellent flavor; when fully ripe has the flavor of the banana. Ripens last of September. A free-stone. You only have to eat some of the fruit to appreciate its merit. Price 25c each.
