General Information and Suggestions To Customers

Garden and Flower Seeds.

Unless otherwise noted, all Garden and Flower Seeds are sent prepaid by us except pound lots or more of Peas, Beans and Sweet Corn. The last three items will be sent by parcel post if postage is added at parcel post rates.

Grass and Field Seeds.

All Grass and Field Seeds, Onion Sets and Potatoes are shipped only at purchaser's expense by express or freight, as ordered. Prices quoted in this catalogue are F. O. B. Lexington. Small quantities of Grass or Field Seeds may be sent by parcel post but postage must be added at parcel post rates.

Order Early.

It is important to order early so as to avoid delay. We aim to fill orders with all possible dispatch but at the height of our busy season we cannot always ship orders the same day they are received. Early orders are given immediate attention. For perishable stock, especially, it is most desirable that we receive your order by March and in general it is best when possible, to send us your order as soon as you receive our catalogue.

Hardy Nursery Stock.

Trees, shrubs, vines and roses are shipped by express or freight during March. Orders should reach us in February.

Vegetable Plants.

These are shipped by express from April 15th to July 1st. Small lots can be mailed, if desired.

Order Blanks.

The using of our blanks is not necessary, however, as any sheet of paper giving your name, address and shipping directions will answer the purpose.

Errors.

We exercise the utmost care in filling orders but in the rush of our busy season, errors will sometimes occur, in which case we shall appreciate being advised of the fact at once and proper corrections will be made. Please keep copies of your orders for reference.

Our Responsibility.

We consider that we are under obligation to fill every order as promptly as possible. If we cannot fill your order for any item, we will at once return the money sent for same. We will not keep your money without adequate returns to you, send you due bill or substitute something you do not want.

Seeds of our Thorobred Brand ordered from this catalogue will prove of satisfactory purity and germination to you or they may be returned at our expense and money paid for same will be cheerfully and promptly refunded without "ifs or ands."

How to Send Money.

Money can be sent safely either by P. O. order, bank draft, express draft, express order or registered letter. If your order amounts to \$1.00 or more it is best to send by one of the above methods. The rates charged for Postal Money Orders and Express Money Orders are now so low that these are the best ways to remit. 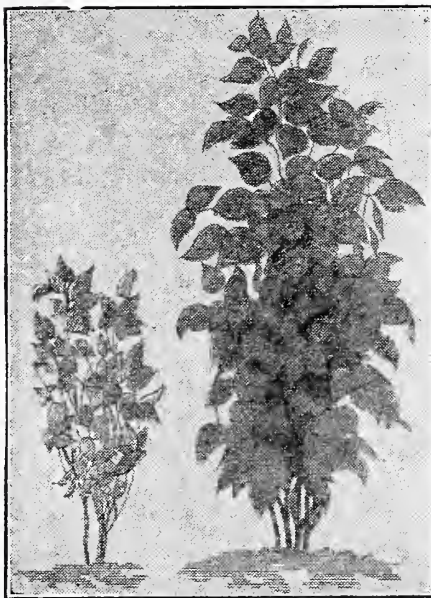
ALFALFA

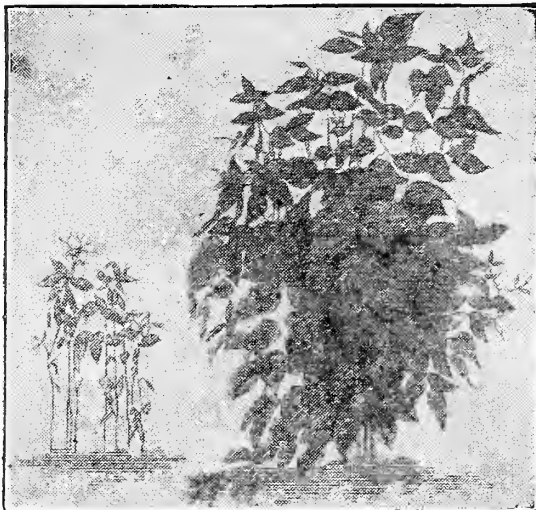

SPRAYERS

Compressed Air and Knapsack

The "Perfection," a Self-Operating Automatic Sprayer.



This machine is one of the strongest and most simple in its parts. The pump is locked by means of sliding cam, which prevents wear, gives long service, and renders all parts instantly accessible. Reservoir holds 4 gallons but should not be over two-thirds full of solution when ready for spraying. About two pumping will empty the tank, and the operator has only to direct the spray. It can be used in the garden, for small trees and shrubs, spraying weeds, spraying cattle, or whitewashing. Cylinders are made of both galvanized iron and brass, with locked seams. It can be carried in the hand or used as a knapsack sprayer. Two nozzles are supplied with each machine, which will throw fine or coarse spray. Equipment consists of two feet 1/2-inch hose, fine

spray nozzle, solid stream cap and stopcock for shutting off. If coarse whitewashing nozzle is wanted, or turned nozzle for spraying low-growing plants, we will quote on request. Other equipments are given below. Full directions, with repair list and spray calendar, accompany each machine.

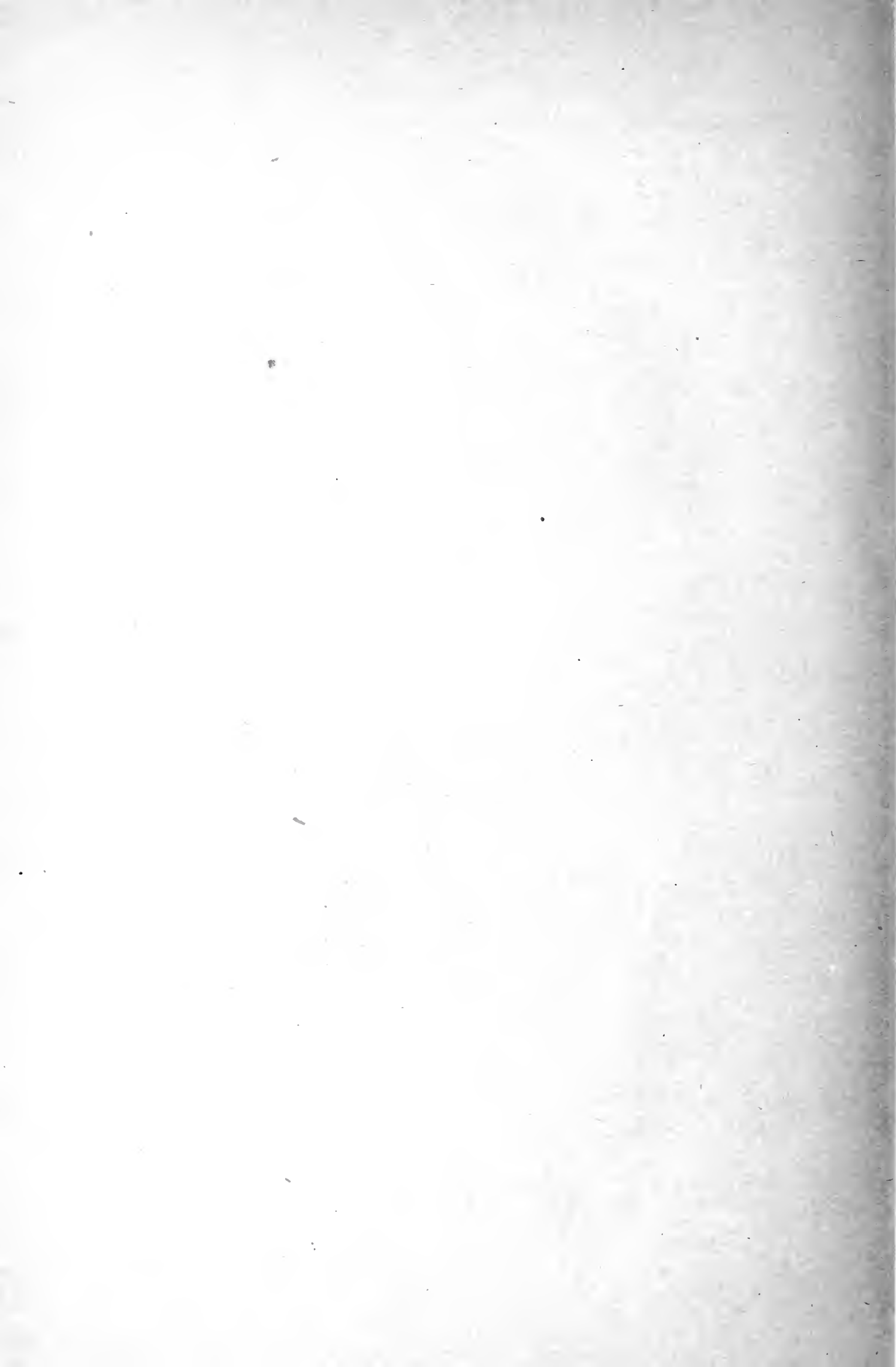
Spare seeding is not economical, especially where the soil is poor.
