#### DIRECTIONS TO CUSTOMERS.

(1.) It pays to order early and have your trees delivered as soon as the weather conditions will premit. We assure safe arrival.

(2.) We recommend early planting, from January 1st, to March 15th, is the best time.

(3.) After receiving trees, cover the roots over with moist soil at once, until ready to plant.

(4.) Before planting, prune off all broken and long roots, peach, plum, apricot, etc., should be pruned back to about 18 inches from ground

#### Correspondence Invited

(5.) Dig holes large enough to allow all roots without cramping Fill holes half full with soil, put in a pail full of water to settle dirt around the roots, then fill up with top soil. The cause of trees failing to start in many instances is due to failure to settle the soil around the roots. Do not tramp the soil, let the water settle the soil

(6.) Every precaution is taken to have each tree and plant true to label. If from any fault of ours a tree is not true to label, we will on proper proof, replace the number.

We warrant all trees and plants to be good, strong and healthy, but having no control over planting or care after delivery to the buyer, we will not be responsible in any way than stated.

(7.) In cases where patrons are not acquainted with varieties the selection may be left to us. When ordering please state whether sub stitution will be allowed, should we be out of any varieties or sizes called for. In the absence of instructions we usually feel at liberty to fill or ders with other similar and if possible better varieties which we may have on hand at the time.

(8.) Caution: Be careful in unpacking to note everything and either plant or cover up with moist soil at once.
