We believe that the present form of our Bulletin is a condensed and concise method of showing varieties, quality and prices of our goods, and you will find sufficient descriptive information of each tree or plant so you will know just what it is, and what you may expect of it, and to us that seems all the information necessary to make out an order.

REMEMBER we send to each party placing an order with us, a thirty-two page instruction book giving full details of the habits of all varieties of trees and shrubbery that is adapted to the Northwest, it tells how, when and where to plant, how to cultivate, how and when to prune, when to spray, and what to use on each variety, it contains all the necessary information to successfully grow all kinds of trees and shrubbery, this little book is of immense value to any one who requires information on how to care for shrubbery, don't allow yourself to be misled into paying two prices for stock of the same variety or quality, or into ordering some unknown specialty or nutried variety that will only bring you loss and failure. Stick to the old reliable varieties that are recommended by our State Horticultural Society and success and profit will be your reward.

QUALITY OF STOCK.

Our Apple, Plum and Cherry trees are budded or grafted, we use scions from our own bearing orchards, and the hardiest and best adapted roots for grafting, our forest and shade trees are grown from native seed and cuttings so there can be no question as to their hardiness; our soil, climate and location is especially adapted to produce trees that are stocky, well branched and especially well rooted. Their growth in the Nursery here is not so rapid as the Nurseries further south secure, but their medium normal growth seems to mature as it forms, and makes a tree of strong vitality, one that is able to resist unseasonal and severe cold, and produce fruit at an early age. Do not allow any persuasion or influence to convince you that our stock is of poor quality simply because our prices are cheaper than others, for there is no better stock anywhere or at any price. We use the latest methods in packing and guarantee goods to reach destination in a good healthy growing condition, or your money refunded.

HOW TO ORDER.

ORDER EARLY. The early orders always get the best attention, and you are sure to get your first choice while our stock is complete. If you do not want to remit in full with your early order send one-third of the amount and balance can be sent later, give number, size and age of each article, write name plainly, also post office, freight or express office, or by parcel post. All trees and shrubbery under two feet can be sent by parcel post, however it is better to have all stock shipped by freight or express.

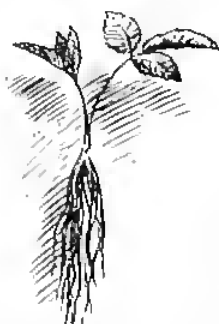

Old Process Plants.

The method of producing what we call the old process plant is as follows, a field of plants is put out in the spring and allowed to form new plants the same season. Now the trouble with this method is that the parent plant has to struggle along a part of the season to make a life of it itself, and is too weak and hasn't the time to form and mature a good strong healthy new plant, and especially so if the season has been unfavorable for trans- such poor success, but it was the best the poor weak parent plant could produce.

OUR NEW PROCESS PLANTS.

We plant in rows 5 feet apart and 2 feet in the row, and cultivate thoroughly the first and second year, and confine the Parent Plants in hills as much as possible the first season, we remove the first blossoms from the Parent Plants the second season to cause them to start runners for new plants early in the season, for the earlier the new plant is formed the stronger and more vigorous it will be, you will readily see by this method that our Parent Plants have had a year's growth and have reached their maturity, and are in a condition to produce better plants than they could the first season when they were struggling along trying to live and add to their own growth, you will find that our new process plants have stronger crowns, better roots, which will enable them to adapt themselves to new conditions and bear better fruit and more of it, than the old process plant, they are worth more than double the difference we make in the prices.
