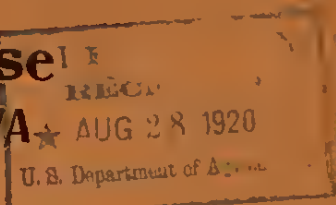

Plant them when you please. I can't stop you. You will do it anyway. However, we find if the weather is favorable we have the best luck to plant early, and if the ground is in good shape to plant corn would recommend it. However, with favorable weather they can be planted nearly any time. They are easy to grow. Never let the roots get the least dry and always plant firmly. We grow every evergreen we sell and they are only dug as wanted. The Black Hills Spruce is the easiest to grow and our best tree.
