
SPECIAL NOTICE

For the first time in our experience we are this year listing Peas, Beans and Corn by the pound instead of by the bushel. The reason for this is the honest difference of opinion as to just what constitutes a bushel.

Wrinkled peas generally weigh about 56 and smooth varieties 60 pounds per bushel. Beans vary from 54 to 60, while sweet corn varies all the way from 42 to 52. In recent years there has been much State Legislation on the subject with the result that some states now require all seeds to be sold by the pound. Some name one weight for a bushel and some another, thus adding to the confusion until it is difficult for either buyer or seller to know what to expect for a bushel.

We believe the simple and complete remedy is to buy and sell everything by the pound and, while it will be a little awkward to all of us at first, we will soon become accustomed to think in pounds instead of bushels and will know exactly what quantity we are thinking about.
