INSTRUCTIONS

How to Trench Order cuttings as early as possible. Dig or plow the trench, and heel cuttings with butts up. Cover with about one-half inch of dirt. The trench can be made either in hothouse or outdoors, but quicker results can be obtained in a hothouse.

How to Root As soon as the roots start from butts, cuttings should be removed from trench, and bedded early in spring. Be sure that roots do not dry out before bedding.

How to Bed Have your ground or garden in good condition. Plow a furrow and place cuttings with butts down, just the opposite to trenching. Put them about three inches apart in rows wide enough to hoe or cultivate. When covering, be careful to leave top bud above the ground.

If you have only a few cuttings to plant, you can bed them by hand. Work them well, and you should have thriving one-year vines by fall. For two-year vines, leave cuttings in ground another season, covering well to prevent freezing. Our cuttings can be grown in any good soil.
