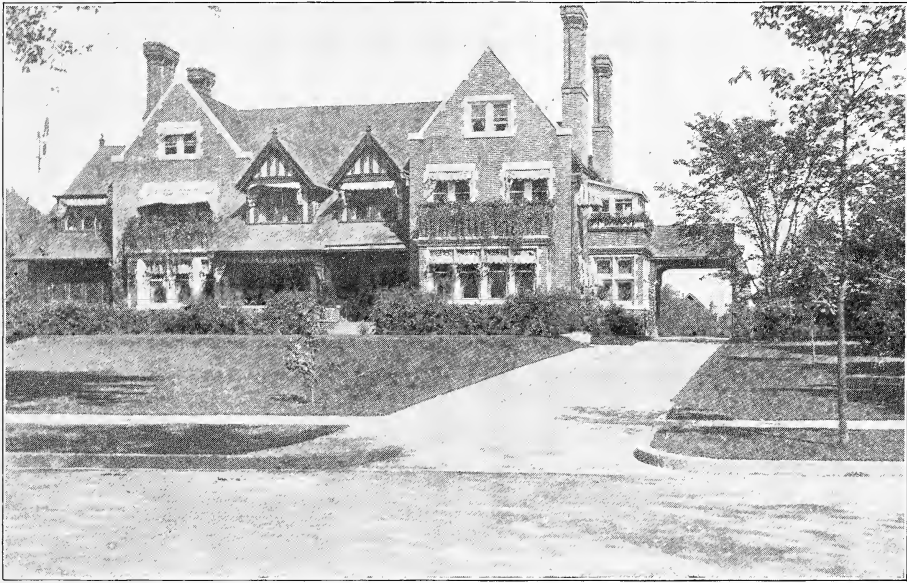

How to Make Your Home Beautiful

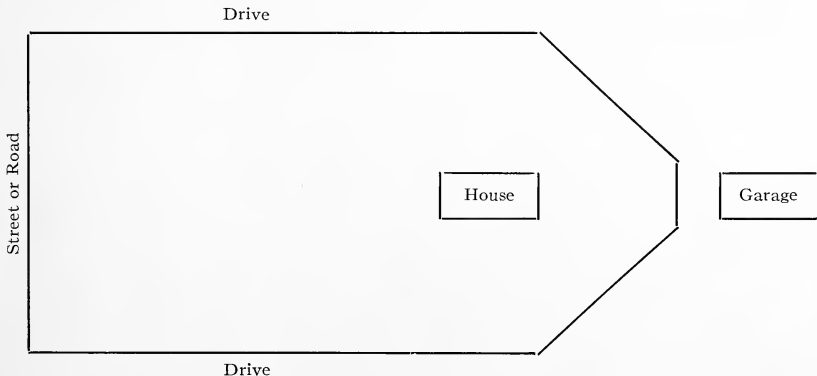

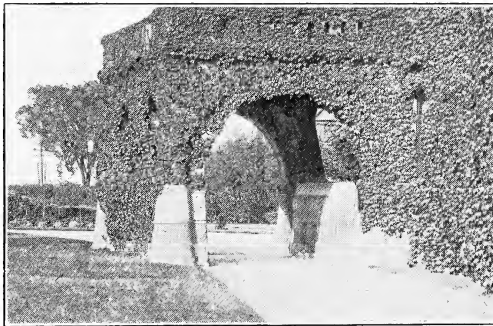
