

A FEW facts concerning St. Regis red raspberries and why you should buy them from me.

The St. Regis is very hardy. It winters better than any other variety I know of.

They are less liable to be affected by root-gall.

They are a good shipper and a bright red color.

They come earlier than any other variety we know of.

You will get a good paying second crop. They are no experiment, as we have grown them here where they originated for several years; in fact, all other varieties are almost discarded here in this section, and this is a large raspberry growing section.

Now, why should you buy from me? Because I will give you the best references that can be had. Because I have been a farmer all my life and I fully realize the futility of planting poor plants.

Because I am right here in the centre where practically all the St. Regis are grown. They will be dug and shipped direct with but one small profit.

If I were in it simply for the dollar, I could offer you a dozen so-called new varieties of plants. The fact is, the St. Regis is a moneymaker. You will find out later that you have made a mistake if you do not plant a patch. About six years ago I planted 20 acres of Miller raspberries. At this time, if I could have gotten enough St. Regis plants and planted the 20 acres with them instead of the Miller, I honestly believe I would have been \$10,000 in pocket.

I give you fair warning, do not make the mistake that I made.
