WINDBREAKS AND HEDGES



In addition to the TWELVE COLLECTIONS OF EVERGREENS BY MAIL as listed on page 15 of our price-list, we can offer this year some of the most desirable and popular kinds of TRANSPLANTED EVERGREENS FOR WINDBREAKS AND HEDGE PLANTING in sizes which allow of quick results.



PLANTING DIRECTIONS.

For planting windbreaks, work the ground as deep as possible and enrich it by adding some well rotted compost or fertilizer. Plant the trees ten feet apart and if possible allow for three rows, ten feet apart. The outer row should then be planted with the quick and tall growing White Pine, the middle row with Norway Spruce and the inside row with American Arbor Vitae. Keep the space between the trees well worked during the first few years.

Prepare the ground in the same manner for hedges, but plant the trees in a single row about one foot apart. Do not cut the hedge back when planted but the second summer in May just after the new growth starts, a clipping will be necessary.

At the low prices at which we can supply this larger transplanted stock, it should prove even more popular than the seedling plants which we have been permitted to sell to a large number of satisfied customers in the past.

A Few Suggestions on Sowing Tree Seeds.

Sow small quantities in cold frames or in shallow boxes filled with carefully sifted, mellow, sandy loam. Larger quantities sow in seed-beds, which must be naturally or artificially sheltered from heavy east or northeast winds. Enrich soil with well rotted manure. Work the soil (a well drained sandy loam) thoroughly to a depth of twelve inches, removing sticks, stones, etc. Destroy weeds before sowing and avoid subsequent annoyance. Seed-beds can be used for a number of years.

Seeds with hard shells (like Robinia) soak in almost boiling water before sowing.

Seeds with thick pulp (like Magnolia) soften in water and wash off pulp immediately before sowing.

Seeds which naturally dry up or which will not start growth for a year or longer after planting, "stratify" by placing them in boxes or other vessels between alternate layers of sand, storing them in sheltered places out of the way of mice and other vermin. In due time sow like any other seeds. Keep stratified seeds moist. Sow broadcast or in drills. Drills facilitate cultivation. Cover seeds with soil equal to about the thickness of the seeds. Do not cover seeds too deep, especially not those of conifers; light mulch of seed-beds with moss, pine needles or similar material assists in retaining an even moisture. After sowing, press soil firmly with roller or back of spade and water thoroughly with fine spray. Shade seed-beds until seedlings appear, when shade must be removed gradually. Keep beds well weeded at all times.

To prevent "dampening off," sprinkle pulverized charcoal over and between the seedlings.
