
YEARLING UNBRANCHED APPLE GRAFTS Showing the entire root system developed in eight months

From Planting These were carefully dug by spades and hand to save all of the long tender fibres, merely to demonstrate the fertility of our soil and the vigorous root growth produced, which in turn means sturdy, healthy trees. It is self-evident that we cannot deliver, nor could our customers successfully plant full length roots like that. All our trees are dug with a large eight to ten-horse digger, consisting of a heavy broad blade in "U" shape form about 24 inches wide by 20 inches deep, which cuts completely under the tree from both sides without marring or mutilating the roots and leaving on the tree a root system unobtainable by the old spade dug method.

SPECIAL NOTICE—We have salesmen representing us in almost every locality in the west who are prepared to furnish proper credentials. Occasionally an unprincipled individual has used the catalog of some prominent nursery in booking orders in his own name, supplying stock bought from unreliable sources. If our patrons will notify us of anyone whom they have reason to believe is not a regularly appointed salesman, we shall consider it a favor.



The Massachusetts Forestry Association, for determining the value of shade trees on streets, asked a large number of practical real estate men this question: "How much do full-grown shade trees, along the street, improve the value of adjoining residence property?"

The majority of answers lay between ten and fifty per cent, while the average was between twenty-five and forty per cent. This means that residence property valued at \$2,000 would be enhanced in value by the use of shade trees from \$500 to \$500. How much do ornamentals enhance the value of property? Look at the adjoining pictures and decide for yourself how much the use of ornamental trees, shrubs, vines, roses, etc., enhanced the value of that property.
