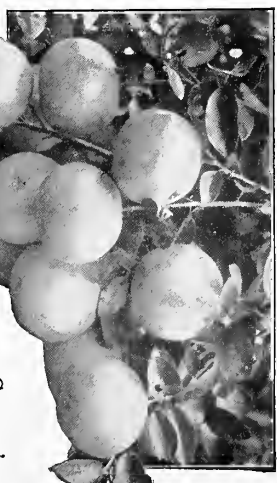

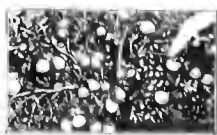

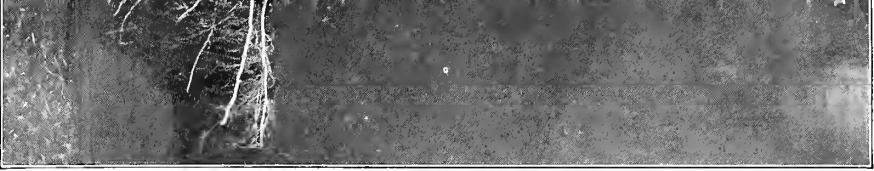

"CITRUS FRUITS," by Dr. J. Ehot Coit, Professor of Citriculture in the University of California, etc., etc., is a book of 250 pages, finely illustrated and giving the best California practice. It is published by the Macmillan Co. of New York City, and costs \$2.00, and postage 20 cents; total \$2.20. It is later than the other book, being published in 1915. I advise the purchase of both books, and can obtain this book also.
