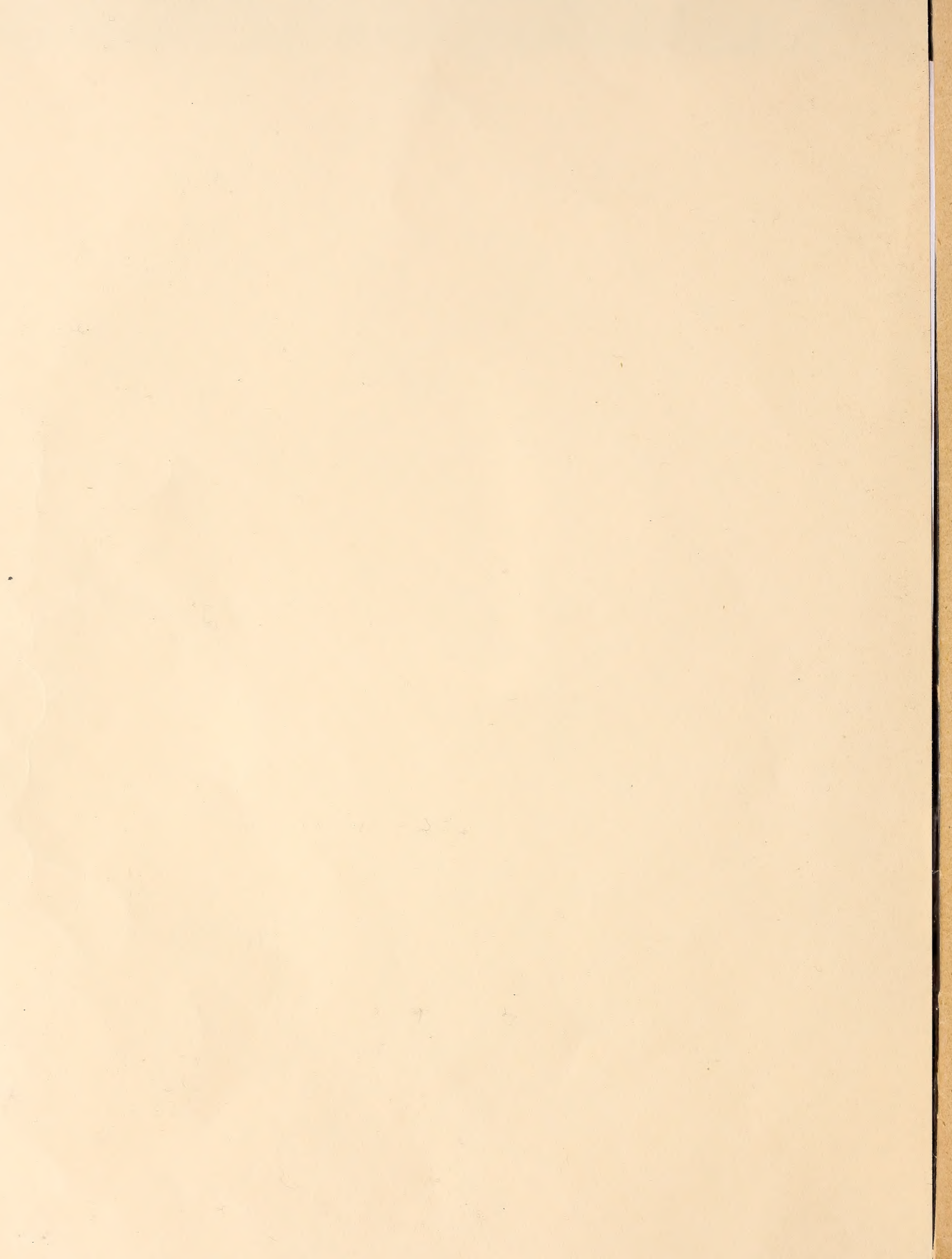

Orders from unknown correspondents must be accompanied by the money to pay for the goods, or satisfactory references.

By Special Arrangement all seeds, bulbs and plants are delivered by express to any express office in the United States at 20 per cent less than regular tariff rates.

In the absence of shipping instructions, we will use our own judgment regarding the best route.

We make no charge for boxes, barrels, packing or cartage. Bags only are charged for, and these at cost price.

While we adhere to the prices herein quoted as far as possible, we reserve the right to change the price without notice as the market value changes.

TESTED SEEDS—Our seeds are all tested, a precautionary measure of great value to customers and to ourselves, and none are allowed to leave our establishment until we are satisfied that they are absolutely of the best quality, possess the greatest possible vitality and are certain to grow under favorable conditions. That under favorable conditions they do grow and give entire satisfaction, is fully testified to by the many flattering testimonials we annually receive from our customers. We, however, give no warranty, express or implied, as to description, quality, productiveness, or any other matter of any seeds, bulbs or plants we send out, and we will not be in any way responsible for the crop. If the purchaser does not accept the goods on these terms they are at once to be returned.

We deliver free anywhere in the United States by mail, express or freight, all seeds in packets, ounces and quarter pounds.

Purchasers pay transit on seeds in bulk, viz: pounds, pints, quarts, pecks, bushels and upwards, and on all Plants (except where otherwise noted), Implements, Fertilizers, Insecticides, etc. When wanted by mail, add to the list price 8 cents per pound, 15 cents per quart for Beans and Peas; 10 cents per quart for Sweet Corn, and 15 cents per quart for Field Corn.

We Guarantee the Safe Arrival of Seeds—In the event of the arrival of packages in bad condition, notice should be sent us at once and we will cheerfully replace the same free of charge. When customers do not receive their goods in a reasonable time, they should inform us and at the same time send a copy of their order, so we can trace order.

Low Prices—We grow and handle seeds in large quantities. Our business, both wholesale and retail, is ever and rapidly on the increase. And our facilities for handling seeds, receiving and filling orders, packing and shipping, are being improved, where possible. With all of these advantages, we are enabled to make very low prices. We are confident they compare favorably with those of any reliable seedman in the United States.

Orders from New Customers—Persons unknown to us, to avoid delay, will please send remittance, or satisfactory city reference with their orders. We decline to ship C. O. D. to unknown customers, unless sufficient money is sent to guarantee acceptance.

How to Remit—Money may be sent at our risk and expense, in the following manner: P. O. Money Order, Bank Draft on New York, Chicago or Milwaukee, Express Money Order or Registered Letter. Money sent in any other way than as specified above is entirely at the risk of the sender. We accept Postage Stamps for small amounts, the same as cash.

When to Order Seeds—Order early, is our invariable advice to customers. We plan to have our catalogue reach them at what we believe to be a proper time to give seed orders consideration. To avoid a rush and perhaps delays in the very busy months of spring near seed-time, it is a great convenience to ourselves, and very often an advantage to purchasers, if orders are sent to us early; if the goods are not wanted immediately, we will get them ready and ship at any date desired.

All plants will be shipped by express, unless specially ordered otherwise. Freight shipments go forward at purchaser's risk.

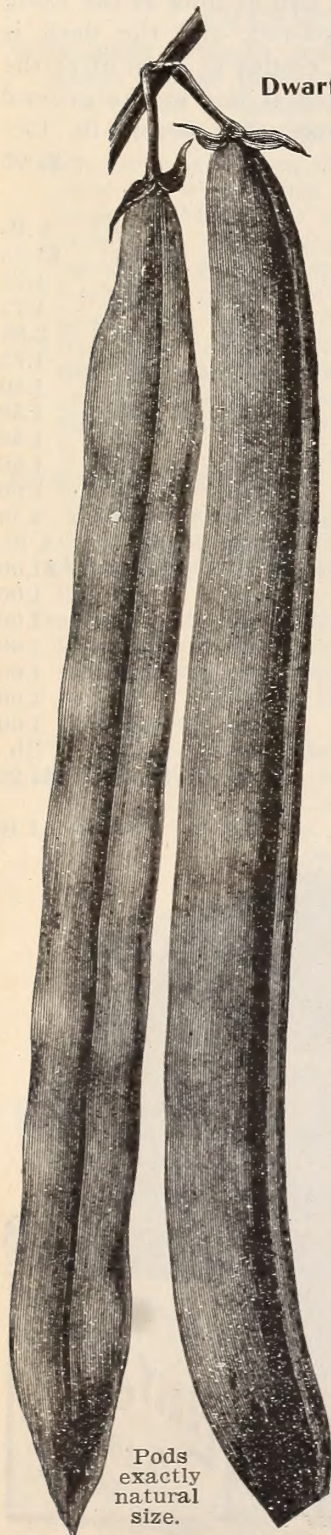

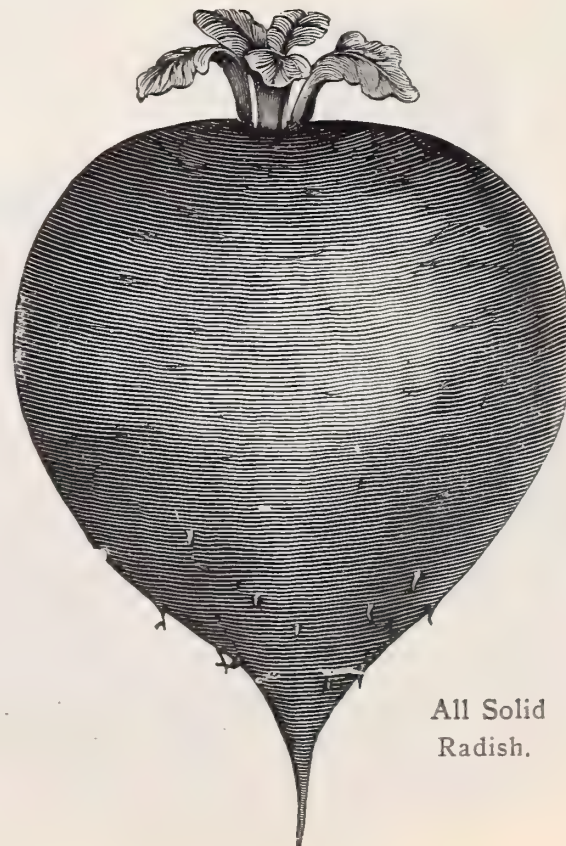
