We have lately taken up lat propagation of Conifers, and have been very successful with it. We witer, for delivery this spring, the following list of plants from $21 / 2$ inch pots, propasated edrly in the winter and well established by May 1st:


ROSES, Dorment Plants from $2 \frac{1}{2}$ inch Pots
The dbove roses were propagated last summer and have been carried over the winter in dormant condition. We find stock of this sort can be safely planted in the fields very early in the spring, and it gives much better growth than do plants from green houses, which necessarily cannot be planted until danger from frost is over:

3000 Aviator Bleriot, a Wichuriana Hybrid of fine saffron yellow color, with golden yellow center. Promises to be decidedly the finest rose of this class, $\$ 6.00$ per 100
