Springfield, Ohio, U. S. A., is centrally located geographically and with excellent facilities for shipping orders by mail or express. Here is headquarters for growing and shipping of all kinds of Plants and especially of Roses where they are produced in greater quantities than any other place in the world.

Comparative Value of Roses Don't think any Rose too small to propagate. The roots of one-year plants being carefully protected in pots, permitting them to be shipped anywhere. Roses of this size are to be recommended for all Rose-growing sections. If you wish the largest and best four to five-inch pots are to be recommended.

Advantage of Pot Grown Roses There is another advantage in planting pot-grown Roses; namely, that they can be planted at any time of the year. The ball of earth contains all of the fine fibrous roots, and when the plants are shipped transplanting can be done with no more injury to the plant than if the Rose had simply been removed to a larger sized pot. The growth continues just the same and the roots do not have to establish themselves, as is the case with the dormant plants. The pot-grown Rose, therefore, has many advantages over other Roses.

Instruction Leaflets On different pages in our catalogue we offer leaflets giving full Cultural Directions on practically all of the different classes of Plants that we sell. Offering leaflets in this way we are not compelled to ask from those who purchase a limited number of articles a large price for a complete book of instructions. Remittance With Order Please send sufficient money to cover your entire order. The safest way is by means of postoffice order. If these are lost a duplicate can easily be obtained, and there is no danger of their being stolen, for no one can obtain money on them except the person to whom they are addressed. They can be obtained at all postoffices. The fee is but five cents for \$5.00 and under.

Surprise Offer After-Season Sales

Propagating as we do six months in advance of the selling season, we must not be satisfied until we have taxed the limit of our capacity and made allowance for natural increase of business. As a result we generally have a surplus of all kinds of plants and rather than carry this stock over, we hold a Clearance Sale beginning June 1, and make up Surprise Collections of miscellaneous Plants at 88c per collection, six collections for \$4.88. In these 88c collections we give several dollars worth of plants. The plants in these collections must be strictly our selection. We guarantee safe delivery and satisfaction.

Parcels Post

Heretofore the limit of weight of a package of mailable plants, bulbs and seeds has been four pounds. The newly established system of Parcels Post simply gives the added privilege of transferring through the mails, packages of mailable plants, bulbs, seeds etc., of increased weights. Do not construe this to mean however, that the increased size of package allows carrying express size plants. It only permits of sending you larger orders of mailable plants.

Shipment of Plants

Mailable plants, bulbs, and seeds are sent by parcels post mail. All such delivered postpaid. Express size plants travel at special rates from Springfield at from 25 to 33 1-3 per cent, less than regular rates. Purchaser pays expressage.

Our Nursery Department

is separate and distinct from our greenhouse, and it is necessary, therefore, that all items from this department (pages 92 and 93) be shipped direct from our nursery under separate transportation charges.

Our terms being cash with the order enables us to give additional plants, bulbs, and seeds on orders amounting to \$1.00 or more, as follows: On \$1.00 worth of goods bought at single Plant Bulb, or Packet prices, select plants, bulbs or seeds to the value of 20c extra. On \$6.00 select \$1.20 extra, etc. Larger orders, premiums in proportion.

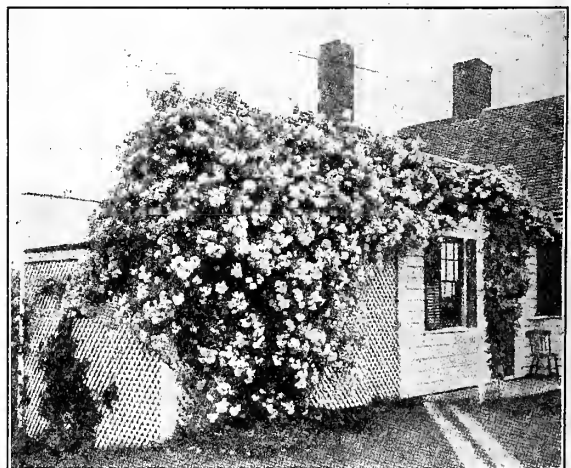

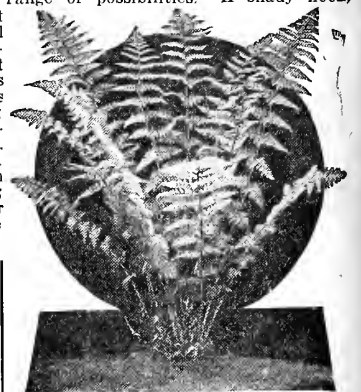

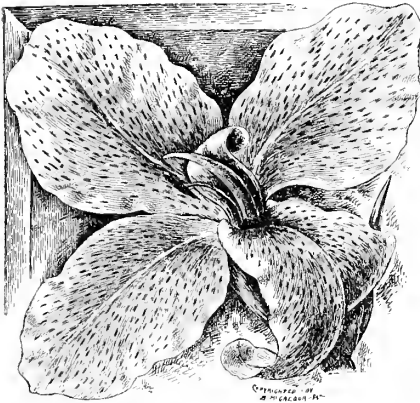

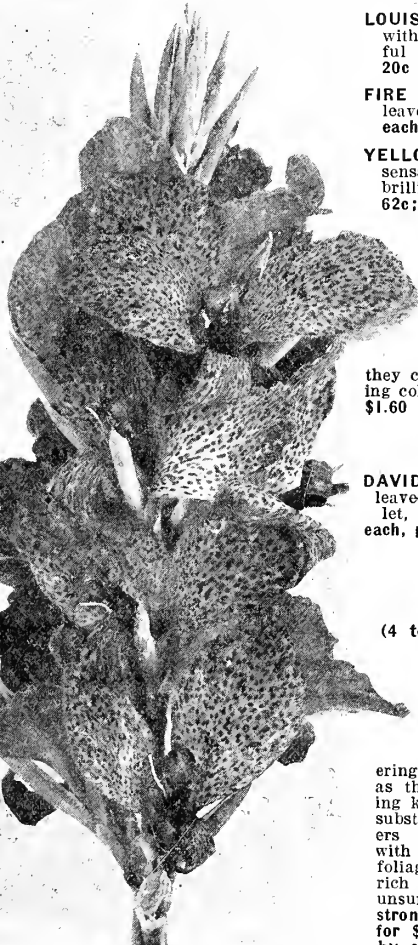

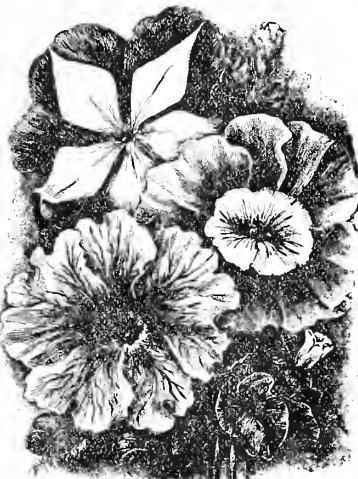

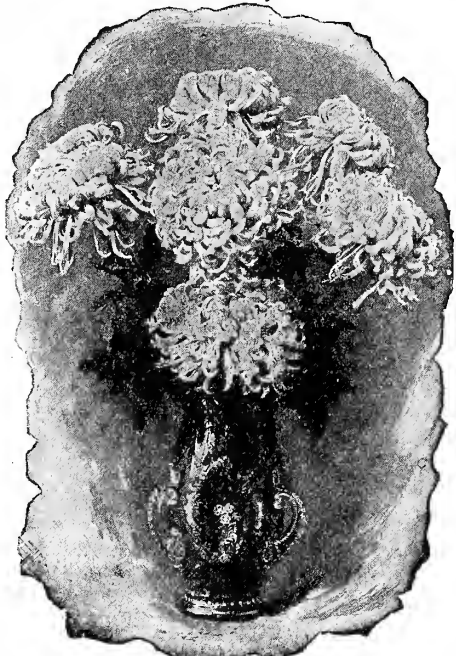

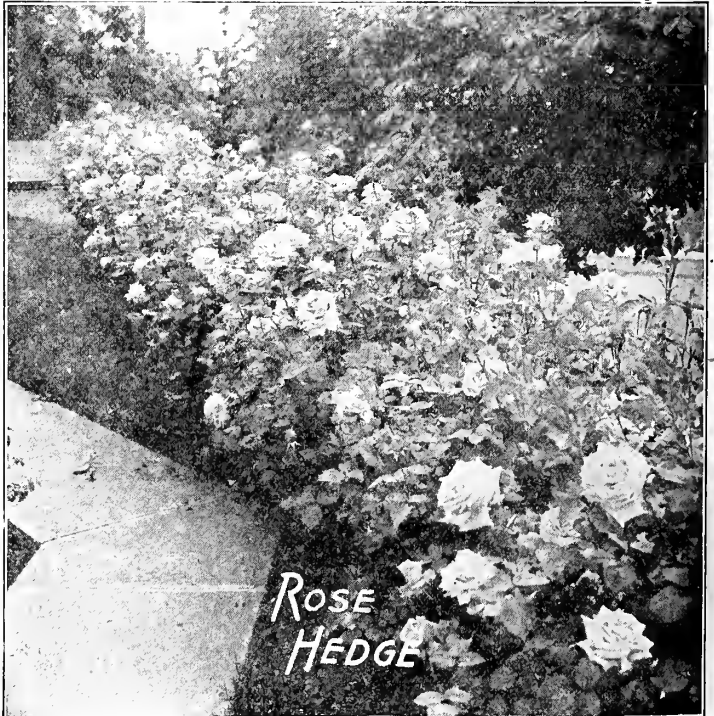


Illustration showing the blooming qualities and habit of growth of the beautiful shell-pink hardy, everblooming bush Rose, Clothilde Soupert. 15c.

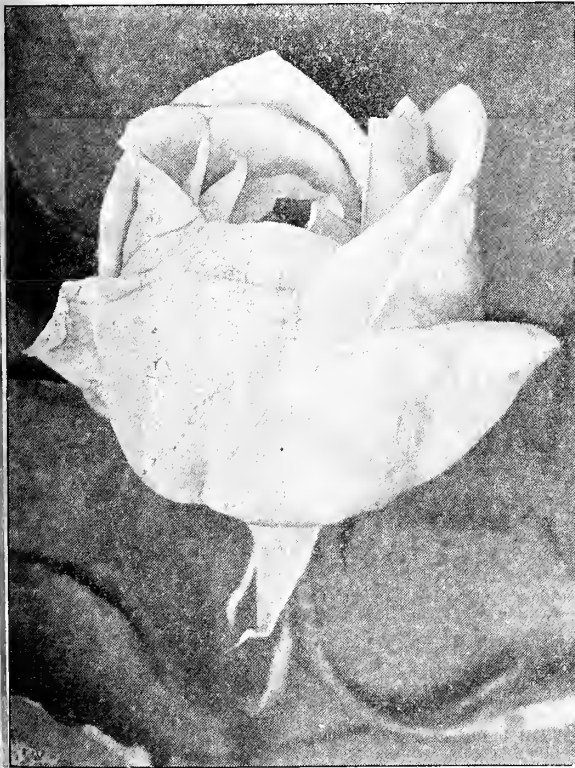

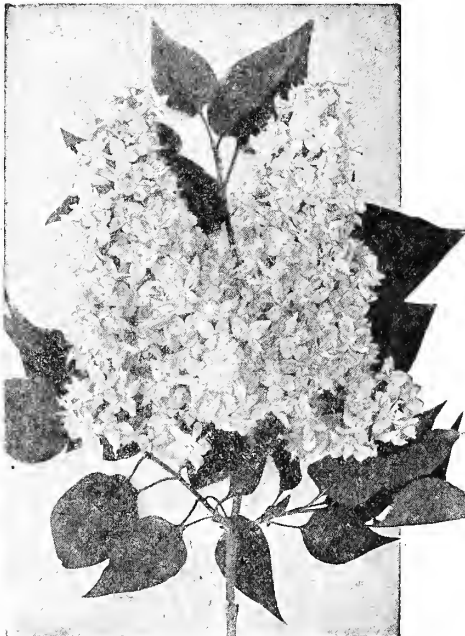

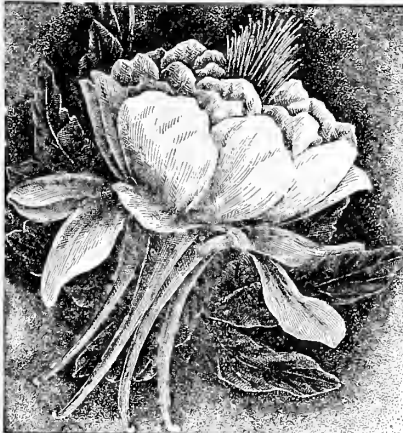

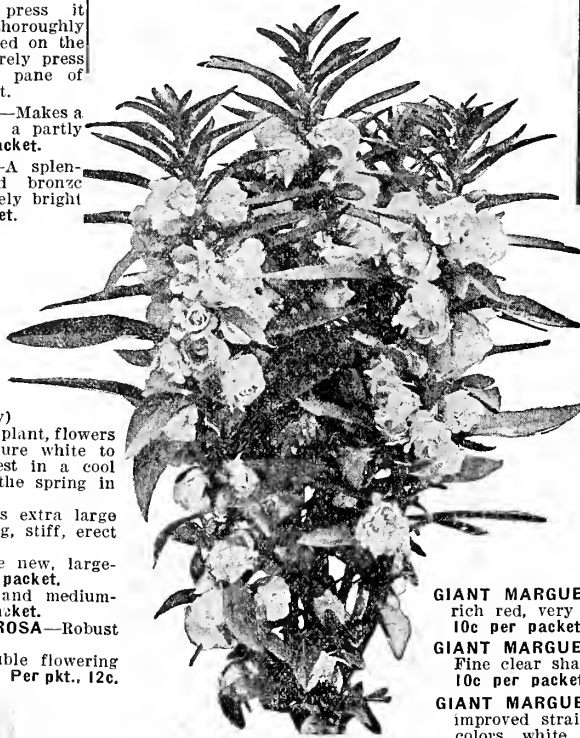

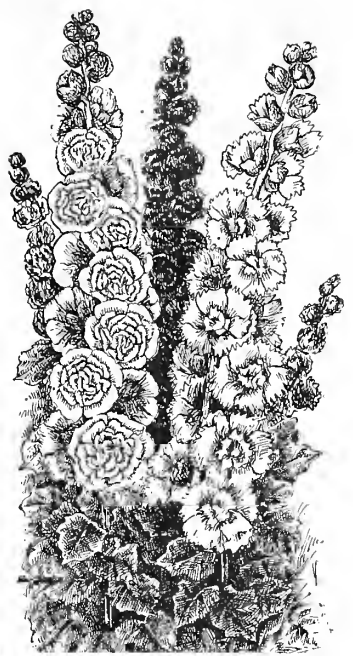

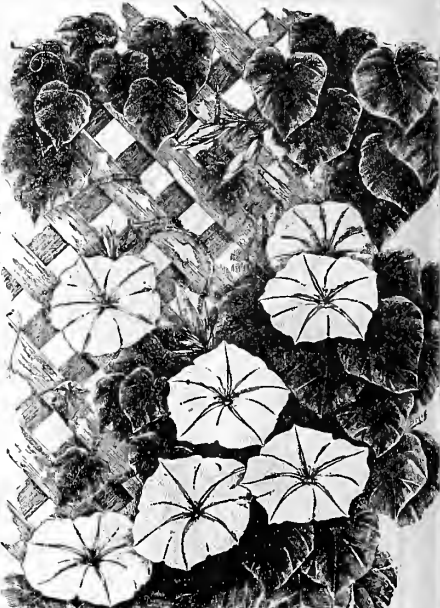

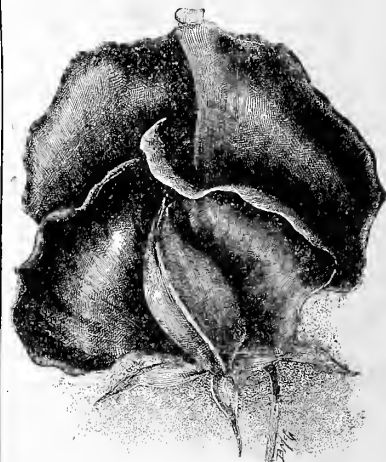
