TERMS.—Cash, except when expressly agreed otherwise. Packing will be done in the best manner, in bales or boxes, at the cost of the purchaser; but no charge will be made for delivering the boxes at the railroad.

All articles, after leaving our hands in good condition, are entirely at the risk of the purchaser; and no complaint will be allowed unless made within ten days after receipt of goods.

While we are extremely particular in having our trees and plants true to name and free from mixture, mistakes may occur, and it is therefore mutually agreed between the purchaser and us that we will be held responsible only so far as to replace such trees as, on proper proof, may be found to be untrue to label, or refund the amount originally received for them.

NOTICE.—We are not responsible for Dealers' mistakes in over-ordering, and we will NOT give credit for stock left over in trenches unless error is made by us.

Our nurseries are inspected every year, and every shipment will be accompanied by a certificate of the State Examiner. As a further precaution all fruit trees will be fumigated before shipment.
