

SUMMER BEDDING PLANTS


These plants are all carefully grown in greenhouses in two and 2½-inch pots, and are sent out in healthy condition, properly labeled. While most of the stock is ready by April 15th, we shall endeavor to use our judgment as to time to ship, according to weather conditions, usually safe by May 1st and until in June.

Plants are priced net, purchaser to pay transportation, six at the dozen rate. We recommend by express, since plants take General Special rate. If wanted by mail, we pack in wet moss. Add postage
