

Terms of Sale

PHILADELPHIA, February, 1920. All invoices for purchases made after this date will be charged at the prices quoted herein, unless special offers are made by letter or telegram and referred to in the order.

The prices quoted are those ruling at this date. We expect to adhere to them through the spring, except where important changes compel us to advance or reduce our prices, in which case we shall be governed by the market.

Credit and Terms of Payment To regular customers and well-known houses of established credit our terms are 60 days net (except where otherwise stated). Sixty days is the limit of time for payment of invoices for purchases from this catalog. All customers whose remittances have not been received 90 days after date of invoice will be drawn upon with sight drafts unless other arrangements were made by agreement.

Cash Discount Grass and Clover Seeds, Onion Sets, and Seed Potatoes are Net Cash. On all other purchases we allow 2 per cent. discount for payment within 10 days from date of invoice. We cannot ship Onion Sets, Seed Potatoes, Roots, or Bulbs C. O. D.

Packing We make no charge for packing or cartage, but Bags and Cases will be charged at current cost.

Ten pounds or more of a single variety will be invoiced at the rates per hundred pounds if ordered in bulk. Orders for sealed single pound packages in any quantity will be invoiced at the single pound rate; half pounds in any quantity at one-half the single pound rate; and quarter pounds at three-tenths the single pound rate.

Ounces, except where priced herein, will be supplied at a discount of 40 per cent. from retail prices, for which see Burpee's Annual for 1920.

Shipping Instructions The prices quoted in this catalog are f.o.b. Philadelphia. After delivering to forwarders in good order (as shown by Bill of Lading) our responsibility ceases. All goods ordered at Wholesale Prices or Discounts travel at expense of purchaser, and when sent by parcel post the cost of postage will be added to the invoice.

Please give complete shipping instructions with each order. Insurance will be effected only when so directed. We cannot offer to ship dealer's orders direct to their customers.
