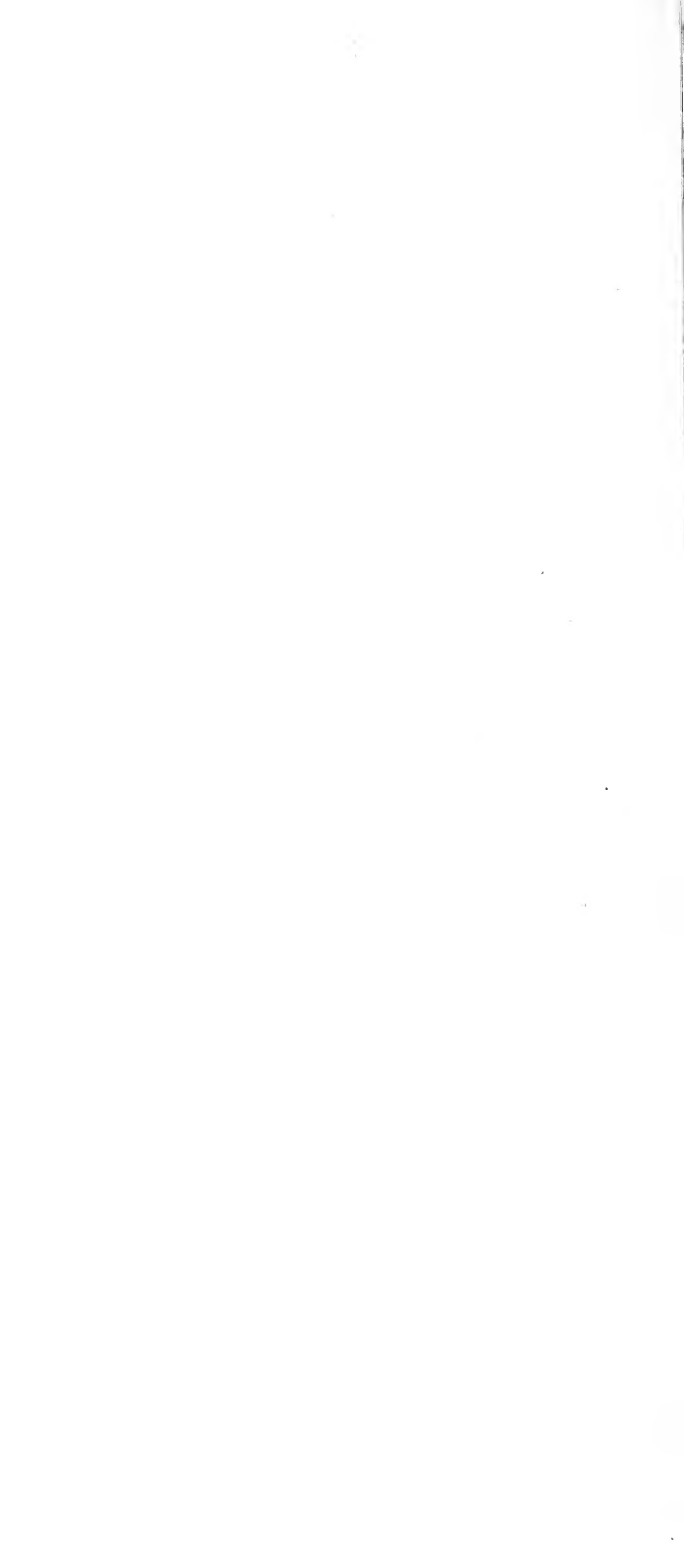

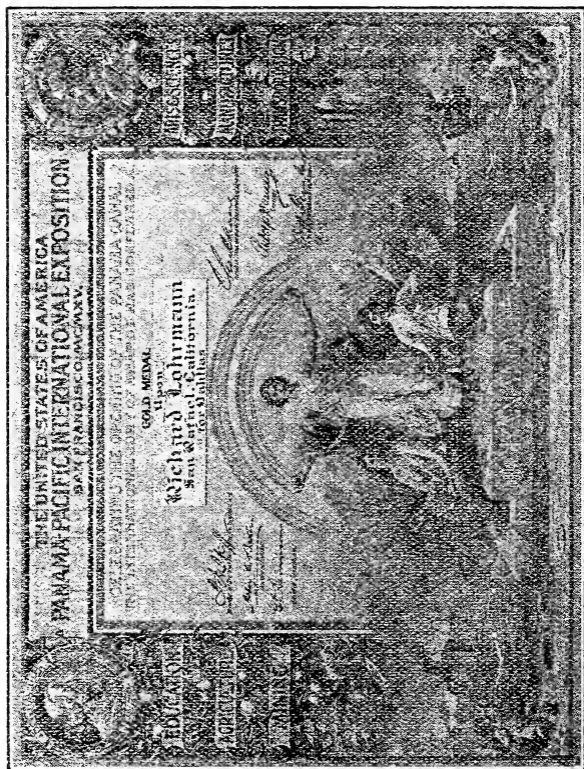

Iris

Iris germanica, commonly called German Iris, Flag-Lilies or Fleur de Lis, are amongst the most desirable and easiest grown of our spring flowering plants. The flowers fairly outrival the orchids in delicacy of structure and wide range of coloring. They are particularly adapted to our California climate, if planted in a well drained sunny location, requiring very little water during the summer. Transplant in late summer and early fall; or any time in the winter, if the ground is not too wet; avoid planting too deep and fresh manure.
