### TERMS AND CREDIT

Usual terms to parties of known responsibility. Cash before shipment required from parties unknown to us or references with sufficient time for investigation before shipment.

### PRICES

We make prices per 100 or 1000 as our stock allows. Will accept orders for any quantity at price named—no extra charge for handling small lots. All prices are subject to change without notice.

### GRADES AND GRADING

We grade LIBERALLY by Caliper and height. When both are specified, Caliper measure governs, but we are careful to see that stock is UNIFORM throughout. Our rule is "WHEN IN DOUBT PUT IT IN THE LOWER GRADE."

All stock is graded and bunched in our frost proof storage house where we have water in abundance supplied by gravity from spring nearby. Stock is handled from field to this building under large taupaulins and roots kept moist until boxed. We guarantee stock to reach you in good condition.

Remedy for loss must lie between the buyer and the Railway Company, but we will gladly render all the aid we can.

Any other claims must be made immediately after receipt of stock.

### CODE WORDS


