Trees are loaded direct from packing room to car—no wagon haul—no exposure—out-of-the-ground-into-the-car in least possible time. Back of this outfit we have plenty of good land that has never grown nursery stock, and we intend that the products of this place shall be WELL GROWN and CAREFULLY GRADED and bring to us each season some portion of your business.

At all times we will be glad to combine shipments with any Huntsville Nurserymen to make up a car load or more, especially where it means, for the buyer, a saving of both time and freight.

TERMS AND CREDIT

Usual terms to parties of known responsibility. Cash before shipment required from parties unknown to us or references with sufficient time for investigation before shipment.

PRICES

We make prices per 100 or 1000 as our stock allows. Will accept orders for any quantity at price named—no extra charge for handling small lots. All prices are subject to change without notice.

GRADES AND GRADING

We grade **LIBERALLY** by Caliper and height. When both are specified, Caliper measure governs, but we are careful to see that stock is **UNIFORM** throughout. Our rule is "WHEN IN DOUBT PUT IT IN THE LOWER GRADE."

All stock is graded and bunched in our frost proof storage house where we have water in abundance supplied by gravity from spring nearby. Stock is handled from field to this building under large taupaulins and roots kept moist until boxed. We guarantee stock to reach you in good condition.

Robert C. Chase is agent at Chase, and our warehouse is the station. Trees are loaded from packing house direct to car—PROMPT SERVICE THUS INSURED.

LIABILITY AND CLAIMS

We are not liable for injury to stock from frost, hail, fire or other causes beyond our control, and book all orders with this understanding. We are not liable for delays in transit; our responsibility ends upon delivery in good order to Railway Company. Remedy for loss must lie between the buyer and the Railway Company, but we will gladly render all the aid we can.

Any other claims must be made immediately after receipt of stock.

CODE WORDS

When more than one grade is listed, a code word is used. While this code is designed particularly for telegraphic orders, it should be more generally used when placing mail orders—so much easier and quicker to simply write the one word which gives us all the information regarding the GRADE of stock wanted. Much expense can be saved in telegraphic orders by using these Code words in connection with Nurserymen's Telegraphic Code, copy of which we will mail upon request.

GUARANTEE

We shall zealously guard the purity of our stock to keep all varieties true to name, but we give no warranty, expressed or implied. Upon proper proof we will replace any that prove otherwise or refund the amount paid, but it is mutually agreed between the purchaser and ourselves that we shall not at any time be held responsible for a greater amount than the purchase price.

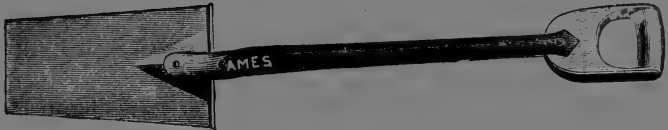

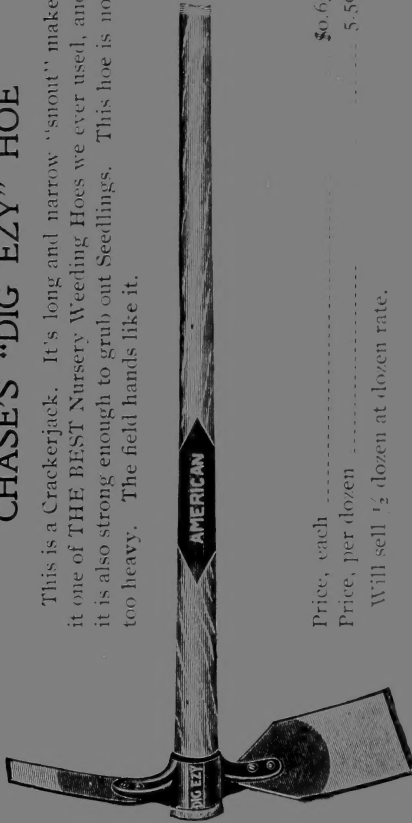
