

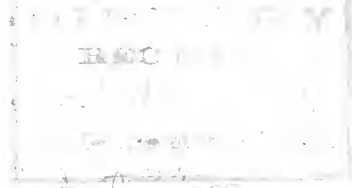

THE VAN WERT IRIS GARDENS

Van Wert Ohio



June 15, 1921.

TO GROWERS OF IRISES:

I own twenty acres in the suburbs of the little city of Van Wert, which during the past seven years I have been using as Peony and Iris Gardens, and on which, in the comparatively near future, I hope to build a house which will become my home for the rest of my life.

In order to carry out the plans of my landscape architect, it will be necessary to move every bed of Iris on the place. In looking over these beds I find that at least half of the stock can be spared without interfering with my regular orders, and so, to avoid replanting the surplus, I will make some very low prices on quantities of twenty-five, fifty or one hundred roots of a single variety, in the hope that other growers may find it advantageous to take the stock immediately. It will take us at least the entire months of July and August to transplant the beds.

During the first two weeks of July we will work on the following varieties, of some of which I have only surplus enough to fill one or two orders of a hundred roots each, so do not be disappointed if your order reaches me too late to be filled. All shipments should be made by express, except should you decide to order as few as twenty-five roots, you can have them sent by parcel post if you will send five cents for each root to cover postage and insurance. I am quite sure that express will be cheaper for the first four zones. If you cannot use these roots during the first two weeks of July, do not order them, as these prices are made for immediate shipment. However during the summer, as I transplant other beds I will make other offerings in which some of these varieties may again appear, as I have different plantings of the same variety.

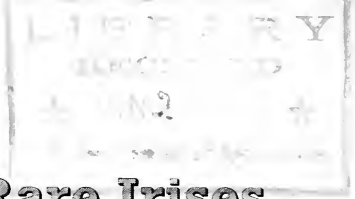
