## BOLGIANO'S RELIABLE BULBS

WHEN TO PLANT. We would particularly emphasize the fact that fall and not spring is the time to plant all kinds of spring-flowering bulbs. The larger part of the bulbs offered are ready to ship the second week in September, a few sorts not until November, when they shall be forwarded.

OUTDOOR CULTURE. The bulbs should be planted as soon after September as possible, so that the roots will make good growth before the cold weather sets in. They may be set out from then until

heavy covering starts the tops prematurely. In the spring or dry litter. Too early and covering should be carefully removed
INDOOR CULTURE. Plant hyacinths in sandy soil, or make the soil porous with leaf-mould. Never feed the bulbs with manure. Give a good soaking after planting and water once or twice a week during the time the bulb makes roots. Put the planted pots in the ground and cover them 3 to 4 inches deep with soil. This prevents the roots from lifting the bulbs out of the pots. After a few weeks, examine the roots and see if they are down to the bottom of the pot. Take up those that you want to flower early, and put them into a dark place in the house, or keep a paper bag over them. When the sprout is as long as a man's finger, they may be brought to the light. Tulips and narcissus are treated the same as hyacinths, except that when brought in from outdoors or the cellar, they can be placed in the full light at once. Instead of pots, you can use common grape baskets to plant in. Treat same as the pots.

DIRECTIONS FOR GROWING HYACINTHS IN WATER. There is much pleasure derived from growing hyacinths in water; select good, large bulbs (single-flowering preferred) and place them in the glasses, allowing the water just to touch them, place them in the dark until thoroughly rooted, changing the water every ten days. A small piece of charcoal in the bottom of the glass prevents the water from fouling. It is advisable to use tubes in order to prevent the bulb from getting handled, so that when the water is changed the bulb may be lifted out with tube.

This is one of the most beautiful of all Cape bulbs, possessing a peculiar grace of form, and its fragrance is most delightful, one pot of five or six bulbs being sufficient to perfume a whole house. As cut-flowers they are extremely valuable; the unexpanded blooms, opening in water, fill the air with most delicate perfume, and their endurance is really remarkable. They force very easily, and can be had in flower at Christmas and continue in succession until June. When potted, these should not be placed in a dark place, like most other bulbs, but should be put directly in the light.
