EVERBEARING STRAWBERRIES.

In starting Everbearing Strawberries it is best to cut off one-third of the roots and set the plants so the crown is even with the surface of the ground. A few day later press the soil about the roots and smooth the surface with the hands.

The following Everbearing varieties have been tested by the Evergreen Plantation and found to be suitable to our climate: Superb. Peerless, Duluth, Lucky Boy, Productive and Progressive.

The Productive is the "mother" of the "New Race" Everbearing varieties, Lucky Cross and Unique—the latter the only Everbearing Strawberry which picks clean in the patch as smooth on the end as a chestnut when it leaves the burr. This is an Idaho production which first grew at New Meadows from a seed.
