All orders must be accompanied by at least 25 per cent. of the amount cash and will then be sent C. O. D. for balance. Should we be sold out of any variety, will send another of equal or better quality, unless otherwise ordered.

In the following list, "B." stands for Ball-type or Show variety, shaped like a ball, and quilled or nearly so; "C." stands for "Cactus" type, having long, pointed or quilled petals; "Cent." stands for "Century," the large Single type; "P." for "Peony-flowered," usually very large and fine stemmed, having two to five rows of artistic petals with curled petals around center; "Pom." stands for Pompon, or miniature Dahlias; "D." for Decorative, the broad, flat petalled varieties; and "Coll." for Collarette, a type of Single Dahlia with an extra row of petals around center.



### CULTURE OF THE DAHLIA

of firm or grower can guarantee the growth of any plant, but if the following rules are observed, anyone may have success with Dahlias.

Select the sunniest spot obtainable. Unless the soil is very poor add no fertilizer; if very poor some good dairy or other manure (well rotted preferred) should be broadcasted; spade or plow deeply and pulverize soil thoroly as early as soil can be worked well.

About May 10th to June 15th, plant your tubers horizontally, about 4 inches deep and about 18 inches apart in rows 3½ feet apart. Keep top soil constantly loose (about 2 inches deep), which will conserve moisture and destroy grass and weeds. Never water the plants unless during genuine drouth, then soak them about every eight days, and re-stir top-soil the day following.

Should you wish to form bushy plants, cut back about one-half of growth when plants are 12 to 15 inches high; this will make them branch and become stocky.

If you have quite a number of plants, drive a heavy stake in each row about every 12 plants and fasten a wire (telephone size preferable) the length of the rows to the stakes, about 18 inches above the soil; your plants will grow up into the wire which will stiffen them; also, should necessity arise, you can tie your plants to this wire.

When buds appear apply Phosphate Fertilizer or liquid manure to your plants (about one pound Phosphate to 20 plants), and stir into soil, repeat again in 3 weeks.

Should mildew threaten, spray with Bordeaux Mixture.

Several days after killing frost, dig your roots, remove the tops and what earth comes off easily, let cure 2 or 3 hours in air and then store away, stem downward if possible, in any ordinary cellar, or in sand or soil in a basement as far from the furnace heat as possible.

Examine occasionally during Winter. In the Spring divide the clumps so as to leave at least one eye or sprout to each division, and plant at time above stated.

Should any tubers received from me fail to grow, report them not later than July 15th and I will replace them next Season for one-half regular price.
