

To Gladiolus Lovers—Greeting:



LADIOLI are among the most popular of all garden flowers. Each year the size, color, and beauty of these wonderful flowers are being improved upon. They are very easy to grow and will do well in almost any soil under any condition. If planted in the richest

place of your garden and given plenty of sun and moisture, they will, however, repay you with extra-large and gorgeous

colors.

To obtain a continuation of blooms during the greatest part of the season, it is advisable to plant at intervals of ten days, from the last week in April until the middle of June.

Some varieties will bloom in seventy-five to eighty days from the date of planting, but most sorts require eightyfive to ninety days.

Plant the bulbs about 5 or 6 inches deep and from 3 to

4 inches apart.

In October, when the foliage has turned yellow, dig the bulbs, cut the stems off within an inch of the bulbs, and dry them thoroughly. Then remove the old roots and store the bulbs in a cool, dry place where frost cannot reach them.

If these instructions are followed, the bulbs will give you

the best results for several years.


No orders of less than fifty cents filled, unless accompanied by extra postage. Small orders are filled with as much care as large ones. Special prices will be sent for large quantities.


