Come and See the Flowers at Mantorville

I am always glad to welcome visitors who are interested in hardy plants, and those who contemplate planting Peonies, Iris, Phlox, Etc., for they can make their selections in the field from the blooming plants with much greater satisfaction than from catalogue descriptions.

The Tulips and Narcissus are at their best in May. From the first to the middle of June the German Iris (over 550 varieties) are at their height, together with the Oriental Poppies (33 varieties) and many of the early-blooming Peonies. The late-blooming Peonies (150 varieties) and Japan Iris bloom the last of the month, and first of July. The middle of June the early-blooming Phlox and Delphinium begin to bloom, and continue until late fall. The late-blooming Phlox (125 varieties) begin to bloom the last of July, and continue until late fall. The Gladioli (150 varieties) and Dahlias (50 varieties) are at their best in August, and the first of September.

The stage from Mantorville meets all trains at Kasson, and passes by the Nursery three times a day. You can reach here via the C. G. W. Railway, also.
