Ilex Verticillata. Deciduous Holly. Gorgeous with scarlet berries in fall and winter.

Kerria Japonica, fl. pl. Double, orange yellow flowers. Green bark in winter. Also, the single variety.
Lilac. Old Homestead. Showy, sweet lilac flowers.
L. Alba. Common White Lilac.
L. Josikea. Bluish purple. 75c.
L. Persian. Lavender.

Lonicera. Bush Honeysuckle. Lovely pink flowers, followed by red berries in profusion.

Rhus Glabra. Common Sumac. Flaming red foliage in fall.

Rhus Cotinus. Smoke Tree. Beautiful masses of misty flowers.

Spirea. Anthony Waterer. Crimson flowers all summer.
S. Aurea. Golden Spirea. One of the best yellowleaved shrubs.
S. Prunifolia, fl. pl. Bridal Wreath. Double white flowers.
S. Thunbergii. Thunberg's Spirea. Delicate drooping foliage. Many white flowers. Foliage beautifully tinted in autumn.
S. Van Houtteii. Van Houtte's Spirea. One of the best spireas. Covered with white clustered flowers.

Symphoricarpus Vulgaris. Coral Berry. Neat habit. Pink berries. Also, Snow Berry, the white berried variety; and Variegata, with green and cream spotted leaves.

Syringa. Fragrant, white, orange-like flowers.
Viburnum Opulus. High Bush Cranberry. White flowers, Large red berries. A fine shrub.
V. Steriles. Snow Ball. A magnificent shrub when covered with large white globular flowers.

Weigelia Rosea. Choice rose-colored flowers.
WV. Variegata. Pink flowers. Foliage white and green.

Willow, Vittelina. Shrubby willow, giving rich effect with its yellow and orange bark in winter.

Lonicera Halleana. Hall's Honeysuckle. Fragrant white and yellow flowers all summer.
L. Sempervirens. Scartet Honeysuckle. Always in bloom.

Lycium Chinensis. Matrimony Vine. Very hardy and vigorous. Scarlet fruit.
Wisteria Chinensis. Long clusters of purple flowers. 75c. each.

Euonymous Radicans. A shrub or rine. Glossy evergreen leaves.
E. Radicans Variegata. White and green leaves. Very showy as an evergreen shrub or vine.
