

I have now been in the berry business for over 25 years, and for the last 15 years I have been making a specialty of growing small fruit plants for the trade. Terms and Conditions of Sale

- PRICES—Quoted F. O. B. Sebastopol, Calif.
- TERMS—Cash or satisfactory references before shipment. To established nurserymen who are known to us, 60 days from date of invoice will be allowed for payment. For cash with order we allow a discount of 3%—2% in 10 days, 1% in 30 days, but all accounts are due 60 days from date of invoice.
- C. O. D. ORDERS should be accompanied by a remittance of at least one-third of the amount of order.
- RESPONSIBILITY—All shipments are at the risk of the purchaser after being delivered in good condition. We will not be responsible for any delay or damage that may occur through the negligence of transportation companies, or horticultural inspectors.
- PACKING—We make no charge for same, which is done in the best of manner to insure perfect travel in transit.
- COMPLAINTS—All errors or claims for shortage must be made within two days after receipt of stock, or they will not be rectified.
- SUBSTITUTIONS—In a mixed order we expect purchasers to state if any substitutions should be made or not in regard to grade or variety.
- GUARANTEE—While I exercise the greatest of care to have all my stock true to name, however it is mutually understood and agreed to between the purchaser and myself, that should any stock prove untrue, I shall in no case be liable for any sum greater than that originally received for such stock that may prove untrue, besides I will not be responsible for the crop. All orders are booked only under the above conditions.
