We herewith hand you our Trade List for the season of 1923.

PEONIES-

We begin to dig about September 10th, as we prefer to let our plants ripen up thoroughly before handling but we can start digging wholesale orders as early as September 1st if so desired.

IRIS-

We find Iris may we safely handled at any time during the growing season, but for the season of 1923 we will begin digging wholesale orders August 15th. This allows of our sending out much more satisfactory stock than would be the case if shipped earlier.

GUARANTEE OF GENUINENESS-

We rogue our stocks constantly during the blooming season, and guarantee our stocks to be genuine and true to name. If a customer should receive stock untrue, it will be the result of a mistake, and in such case we will, upon satisfactory proof of the mistake, supply the customer with true stock to take the place of the stock not true. The customer may keep the stock first sent.

SIZE OF ROOTS-

Quotations in this list are for strong 2 to 4 eye divisions.

SIZE of ORDER-

At the prices quoted 6 may be ordered at the dozen rate, 25 at the hundred rate, and 250 at the thousand rate.

TERMS-

Prices are net. May 1st payment on all spring shipments. November 1st payment on all summer and late fall shipments. Two per cent off for cash within ten days of invoice.

COMPLAINTS-

All complaints must be made within ten days of receipt of stock.

OUR LIST-

The list of varieties which we offer to the trade is not a very long one, but covers such varieties as we have in greatest supply. THE BRAND PEONIES Originated by O. F. BRAND and A. M. BRAND.

We wish to say a few words about those varieties of the Peony originated by the Brands, father and son.

Mr. O. F. Brand planted his first Peony seed in the fall of 1899. That same fall, just a few weeks before this first planting of seed was made, A. M. Brand, the son, returned from his youthful wanderings and entered into business with his father. At this time the nursery firm of O. F. Brand and Son was formed, and father and son worked together in bringing out new peoples for a period of eleven years. It was during these years that this list of peonies was produced that has made the name of the Brands as Peony originators known throughout the world. It was during these years that the Brand Varieties, Brand's Magnificent, Chas. McKellip, Chestine Gowdy, David Harum, Desire, E. B. Browning, Frances Willard, Judge Berry, Longfellow, Lora Dexheimer, Luetta Pfeiffer, Martha Bulloch, Mary Brand, Mrs. A. G. Ruggles, Mrs. Jennie R. Gowdy, Phoebe Cary, Richard Carvel, and Winifred Domme were originated.

BRAND PEONY FARMS, FARIBAULT, MINN

It has taken a good many years for this line of peonies to receive the recognition which was its due. But the second symposium of the American Peony Society, which appears in Bulletin No. 14 of the Society, gives one a very good idea of their comparative merits. This symposium shows how the world's best varieties, old and new, are rated by peony lovers. A study of this symposium shows the following facts: Of the 77 varieties which received 20 or more votes and which scored between 8 and 9, five are Brand Varieties. Their scores are as follows:

We believe that when the next symposium is taken and the merits of the Brand Peonies are better known, that the Red Peonies, Lora Dexheimer, Chas. McKellip, and Winifred Domme will be rated about 8.5.

When Mr. O. F. Brand retired from business in 1911 and the firm of O. F. Brand and Son was dissolved, Mr. A. M. Brand continued the work of producing new peonies. Although none of his originations have yet entered commerce, still we are satisfied that when the first of the 22 varieties which he has selected as worthy of introduction are sent

out, discriminating peony lovers will admit that the standard of excellence established by the older introductions has not been lowered one jot by the newest ones.

In fact, we believe we have in Ella Christiansen, Mrs. A. M. Brand, Mrs. Frank Beach, Myrtle Gentry, and Victory Chateau Thierry some as fine peonies as have ever been produced.
