SWEET PEAS

Varieties for Fall Planting

By sowing Sweet Pea seed in the fall, blooms will be produced very much earlier than those from spring sown seed. The plants will be sturdier and the blossoms will be larger and more brilliant in color. The seed may be planted in October or November in a trench six to eight inches deep and covered two or three inches deep.
