Strawberry Plants

The blossoms of all cultivated strawberries are either bi-sexual (perfect) or pistillate (imperfect). All the varieties offered in this list have perfect blossoms and none, therefore, require the association of another kind in order to be fruitful. We have discarded all pistillate varieties.

Barrymore (Mid-Season to late). A beautiful dark crimson, large fine berry of high quality. \$6.00 per 100.

Brandywine (Mid-Season). Large bright crimson berries of excellent quality and flavor. \$6.00 per 100.

Bushel Basket (Mid Season). A giant in both plant and fruit, enormously prolific and of high quality. \$8.00 per 100.

Campbell's Early. A valuable early variety producing large crops of rich red berries. \$6.00 per 100.

Chesapeake (Mid-Season to late). A popular sort, the berries are large and beautiful, regular in form and size and of excellent flavor. \$7.00 per 100.

Commonwealth. Very late extra large variety, fruit dark red and juicy. \$7.00 per 100.

Edmund Wilson. (Mid-Season). The largest variety in existence; fruit very dark in color and of superb quality. \$8.00 per 100.

Fall Bearing Strawberries

The fall-bearing, or so styled "Ever-bearing" Strawberries are interesting and have merit. Fortunately, nearly all of them are excellent in quality and give a heavy yield of fruit in June. If the blossoms are removed from the plants until the middle to the last of June, the autumn crop will be very greatly improved, both in size and yield. Aside from removing the blossoms by hand picking, the culture of these autumn-bearing varieties is the same as other Strawberries.

Advance. The berries are nearly round, of good size and shape; deep crimson, firm and of good quality. \$9.00 per 100.

Progressive. One of the most popular and prolific of the Fall Bearing sorts. The berries are smooth and uniform in size and shape and of a deep crimson color. \$8.00 per 100.

Lucky Boy. Claimed to be the biggest, sweetest and most productive variety as yet produced. It is larger than "Superb," more round in shape and is very much firmer. \$10.00 per 100.
