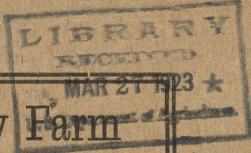

DEWBERRIES

Austin Dewberry is the most widely known and Grown of any Dewberry in America. Very large, black berry. Fine shipper. Originated in Pilot Point in 1889.

Lucretia Dewberry—Originated at Beverly, Virginia, at the close of the civil war. Most wonderful berry. Strong brier and abundant bearer. Very large, jet black berry. Price of both plants 50c per dozen, \$2.25 per hundred, \$15.00 per thousand.

BLACKBERRIES

Dallas—Very vigorous, drooping, thorny, productive, large and fine. Very valuable market variety.

Robison's—Very vigorous, upright brier, prolific, uniformly very large, best quality. Sells at highest market price. Originated by Mr. Willard Robison of Cisco, Texas.

McDonald—A cross between the Blackberry and Dewberry. Ripen about the 10th of May. Price of all plants 50c per dozen, \$2.25 per hundred, \$15 per thousand.

GRAPES

Concord—The old reliable commercial Grape of the world; large black grape and a sure bearer. Price 20c each, \$2 per dozen, \$10 per hundred.

Moore's Early—Very fine, large black grape; heavy bearer. Ripe July 15th. Plants 20c each, \$2.00 per dozen, \$10.00 per hundred.

White Ruby—Excellent white grape, resembling Niagra. Very sweet and a heavy bearer. Plants 20c each, \$2 per dozen. \$10 per hundred.
