

CULTURAL DIRECTIONS:

Plant in well prepared ground, about May 20th. Dig in shovel of cow manure, or two handfuls of commercial fertilizer. Drive stout stake three feet high, lay bulb almost flat with sprout next to stake, cover about four inches. Water thoroughly once a week, avoid sprinkling foliage, except to wash off dust. Cut off all mature flowers before seeding and you will have satisfactory bloom.
