Those of greatest importance were: First for largest and finest display of gladioli; first for best arranged basket of 50 Primulinus Hybrids (photo on front cover); first for largest red variety with Pythia; first for largest single floret with Pythia; first for best purple and yellow in bouquet; first for best twelve varieties under 50c each; first for best five varieties originated in Iowa; first for best American variety with Immensity; first for best foreign variety with Madam Monet Sully; first for best named variety of recent introduction with Ruth Huntington; first for best scarlet with Scarlano; first for best plain petaled variety with Mrs. Dr. Norton; first for best Lemoine type with Mrs. Frank Pendleton; first for largest collection of Kunderd varieties; first for largest collection of Decorah varieties; first for largest collection of Diener varieties; attention is especially called to the first prize given to best arranged basket of fifty spikes of E. J. Shaylor; first for best vase of same variety; also the first prize given to best vase of Anna Eberins. I am especially proud of my winnings on these last two varieties mentioned, having the largest stock of these two greatest commercial varieties in the world.

Special Discount For Early Orders

A range of colors never before So beautiful, long-lived, in store For us all, for funerals, and homes, Weddings, palaces, and Kings domes.


Gladioli—Of all flowers you're my choice; You're my pleasure; in you I rejoice. I cherish and love you more, more and more Each time you're presented in all your galore.

An Investment In Gladioli

Better Than Bonds



F YOU have a little extra time to spare and can invest a little money in Gladioli it can be made most profitable to you. There is need for a hundred times more Gladioli than there is today. so why not make some of the profit to be made in growing them. They are so easily grown and so many can be planted on a small space that only a small amount of ground is necessary from which to make a good income. Most of the largest growers today started but a few years ago with very little capital and have become "well fixed."

No doubt you have often wondered what you could go at that would make a better income for you, nicer work and more leisure than you are now enjoying. Gladioli growing promises just these pleasant opportunities for you, if you will take advantage of it.

I started with an investment of \$30.00 but six years ago, and today have thirty acres in close planting consisting of many millions of bulbs worth several hundred thousand dollars. Not so bad, is it?

If I were not so firmly convinced as to the need of many more growers, I could not afford to tell you of my success. Instead I would have to fear competition by telling you. The market can no more be over-filled than it can with shoes, hats or anything else. It is only necessary to supply the demand with the very best and latest, and the market is there. Of course if you would attempt to fill orders with the same varieties continually the public would become tired of Gladioli, but by adding the best of the new varieties coming into existence every year you can help to keep the public interested, and always on the lookout for new varieties, the same as for new phonograph records, or improvements in the radio.

The beauty of the Gladiolus is unequaled. Their variety is beyond numbers, their uses never fail any occasion, their lasting qualities for bouquet and decorative work is without compare, their season of bloom is from early summer until killing frosts late in the fall and their culture very simple. Where is any flower of which these things can be said? There is none.

If you want to get an idea as to the possible market for Gladioli, try the following scheme. Ask the next ten people you meet, or a hundred would be better, if they know what a Gladiolus is. The answer will surprise you. Most people do not even know what a Gladiolus is, and most of those who do, do not have any in their garden, and only a few of those who do, have any of the later and better varieties. All of the many people who do not know about the flower, or have but few, are possible customers. Everyone likes this flower once they become acquainted with it. Have you ever thought of it in that way?

There is need for a grower in every community to supply cut flowers alone, and if you will make the start, the business will be yours. You can grow enough in the back yard where you are now growing a few dollars worth of vegetables or maybe nothing to greatly increase or perhaps double the present family income, and only your spare time would be required. Really it is surprising what can be done. Gladioli will increase at least five hundred per cent in value each year in the most unfavorable season, and in better years as much or more than one thousand per cent. How does this compare with bonds or any other investment you might make?

A city lot of 50x150 feet requires 12,000 No. 5 size bulbs to plant by making rows 30 inches apart and 4 bulbs to the lineal foot of row.

I want to give you an idea here of what can be done with two different collections, each covering the main colors necessary to start with. In the first list the selection is made with the thought of the cut flower trade principally, by using the more plentiful varieties, the bulbs of which can be furnished at much less money. The second list is made up to be a greater investment in bulbs and for the cut flowers as well.

The labor in each instance is the same, so an investment in the second collection is more desirable, as it requires no more time to handle and no more space to plant and store.

For the purchase of 1000 bulbs each of collection No. 1 an investment of \$215.00 is necessary.


