EUROPEAN AND AMERICAN NOVELTIES

ALL gardening enthusiasts are more or less interested in something new in the Floral World, and for this reason, we keep in touch with all new introductions as they appear from year to year. The few Novelties offered below have been selected by us as having a good claim for merit and well worthy of a trial.

ANTIRRHINUM Nanum Gr'florum "Charm"

A splendid new variety, with all the merit of the now popular Enchantress, large flowers borne on a fine upright spike and very early, but with a richer and deeper shade of color, a beautiful glowing rose. Pkt. 50c.

NICOTIANA Sanderae "Crimson King"

This is by far the deepest and richest color which has yet been produced in the Nicotiana family, a dark velvety crimson red, and its large flowers will be of splendid effect, either alone or in conjunction with the white and other colors of this popular species. Pkt. 50c.

PANSY "Orange King"

A great improvement on the variety introduced some years ago, as "St. Knud." The lower portion of the flower is of a vivid orange color, shading at the center to a lighter tone, whereas a distinct creamy tint is to be seen in the upper petals. Pkt. 35c.

PINK Semperflorens "Perfection"

A splendid strain producing an infinite variety of beautiful shades of red, such as crimson, carmine, pink, rose, salmon, and cinnabar, mostly with an eye of deeper hue. The plants are of a compact habit, extremely floriferous, and possess a delicious odor, which is carried far and wide all around. Pkt. 50c.

STOCK Beauty of Nice "Salmon King"

In habit this resembles in every respect the well-known variety, "Beauty of Nice." The color, a very rich bright salmon rose, has been admired by all who have seen it; the percentage of double flowers is very large. Pkt. 50c.

PRIMULA Eureka "Salmon Pink"

Primula Eureka, the parent of this novelty, has commanded everywhere unstinted praise since its introduction. It will be remembered that an Award of Merit was given by the Royal Horticultural Society.

The variety which we now offer is similar in habit and foliage, but carries flowers of a most beautiful shade of salmon pink, well above the foliage, on long stiff stems.

We feel sure the demand for this novelty will be even greater than that which was experienced when Eureka was introduced. Pkt. 75c.

PRIMULA Malacoides "Fimbriata"

An excellent addition to this very popular class of Primulas. The flowers, of a lovely pink hue, are beautifully and delicately fringed, a phenomenon which has not yet appeared in the Malacoides section, and which enhances immensely the charm of the plant. Both for culture in pots and for cutting, we can strongly recommend this attractive novelty. Pkt. 50c.

STOCK Brompton Hybrid "Exquisite"

This unique Stock is of a more branching habit than the English Brompton. The single flowers are slightly duplicated, all having five petals and occasionally six, but the very distinct coloring is its chief attraction, being a beautiful rosy pink, which has hardly hitherto been seen in stocks. The petals, too, remain expanded, and have less tendency to curl up than in single types, a really beautiful plant. Pkt. 50c.

NOVELTIES IN SWEET PEAS FOR 1924

CHEVALIER

Chevalier is an outstanding new bright rose with just a suspicion of yellow cast evenly over the whole flower. The blooms are of largest size and exquisite form, arranged in fours on a long strong stem. Chevalier was awarded a Certificate of Merit at the International Flower Show, New York, March, 1922, and the National Flower Show, Indianapolis, March, 1922. Pkt. (15 seeds), 25c; ½ oz., \$3.00.

COMRADE

Award of Merit, Royal Show, Newcastle

Undoubtedly this is the finest Sweet Pea of the season. Its superb size and delicate coloring cannot fail to make it one of the finest varieties in existence.

The stately flowers are a lovely cream pink with a delicate maize-apricot coloring, which makes the flowers a most charming shade.

The plant is extremely vigorous, having a very stout vine producing an abundance of four and five-flowered sprays, with an occasional seven and eight; all of which are perfectly placed. Pkt. (10 seeds), 50c.

DAFFODIL

Award of Merit, Royal Show, Newcastle

Though we have not yet reached the age of the yellow Sweet Peas, we have in Daffodil a very distinct yellowness which predominates, especially in the young stage. Daffodil is the greatest advance to the yellow Sweet Pea, up to date. Pkt. (10 seeds), 50c.

KING TUT

King Tut is a pleasing shade of rich rose-pink with wings of a lighter shade. The reverse or back of the standard is heavily flushed with rose-pink on white ground. The flowers of King Tut are enormously large and bold. King Tut was awarded a certificate of Merit at the International Flower Show, New York, March, 1923. Pkt. (15 seeds), 25c; ½ oz., \$3.00.

MISS SPOKANE

Miss Spokane is a flower of immense size, wonderfully waved, and borne on long stems. The standard is peach-red and the wings bright scarlet, giving a bunch effect of rich orange-scarlet. Awarded a Certificate of Merit at the International Flower Show, New York, March, 1922, and at the National Flower Show, Indianapolis, March, 1922. Pkt. (15 seeds), 25c; ½ oz., \$3.00.

QUAKER LADY

This beautiful light Lobelia-violet is just the thing that has been wanting for a long time. The bunch effect is clear rich lavender, but in the younger flowers there is a slight suspicion of rose. Quaker Lady was awarded a Certificate of Merit at the International Flower Show, New York, March, 1922, and at the National Flower Show, Indianapolis, March, 1922. Pkt. RECENT NOVELTIES AND SPECIALTIES—In Flower Seeds

ANTIRRHINUM NANUM GRANDIFLORUM: "MADONNA"

A well-formed white Snapdragon of the broad-petalled grandiflora type, of a dwarf and compact habit, very floriferous with a well furnished spike and makes a fine effect when viewed in the mass. Pkt., 35c.

ANTIRRHINUM MAJUS GRANDIFLORUM: "PEACHBLOW"

No more distinct variety than this has been introduced up to date. The plants bear many massive spikes of bloom and are of most striking aspect when massed.
