When trees are packed for shipment for a distance the roots are cramped up and strained out of their natural position. When you buy trees of me you get them with all possible advantages of a good start—climatized, the roots natural and not destroyed by packing, nor injured by any of the many disadvantages incident to freight shipment of trees. Most all of my stock is home grown, and you can come and see it growing and get it freshly dug.

**Home Grown Trees.**

A thoughtful farmer once marked a \$5 bill which he received from a local merchant in exchange for produce. With the marked bill he paid a portion of his taxes. Some months later the bill passed into his hands again in payment for a hog. This time he applied it on a grocery bill. When he sold his grain the following fall, the same bill, slightly the worse for wear, reposed in his pocketbook once more. This time it paid a portion of the cost of his winter overcoat. When summer came again and the farmer began to sell his garden truck he found the bill in his possession for the fourth time.
