We do not hold nursery stock in cellars during the fall, winter and early spring months, of which we have found out greatly lessens the vitality of trees and plants, our stock is left in the nursery rows where it is grown or dug early in the spring and heeled in ground for immediate delivery.

We would like for you to come to the nursery and make a personal selection of nursery stock, since we now have good roads and automobiles, you can drive several miles, select your trees and plants; fresh dug from the soil and return and have them planted the same day; by so doing you should have complete success. Not like having trees shipped a great distance and having the roots drying out on the way.

OUR GUARANTEE

Our nursery stock is guaranteed True to Name, and up to grade and quality.

The Nursery is inspected annually by the State Entomologist.

We give the greatest of attention in labeling stock, but if any stock proves untrue to name or label we refund purchase price or replace stock upon proof of error.

The successful growth of a tree or plant is de-

pendent upon many conditions over which the nurseryman has no control, viz: the planting, the cultivating and maintenance; the weather, the fertility of the soil, the rainfall, etc. We endeavor to exercise every care that will cause our stock to transplant successfully, and that it leaves our nursery in good healthy condition, but we cannot guarantee tree or plant to live.

Visitors are welcome at all times to inspect and make a selection of stock at nursery.

We do not dig nor sell nursery stock on Sunday.

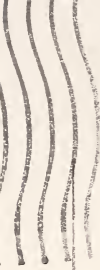
